Stewardship IS A Four Letter Word!

Yes, the above title is true! For so many Christians, *stewardship* is a four letter word-- and that word is “*CARE!*” Yes, “care” is the simplest and best way to define this fancy church word “stewardship!” To be a steward is to be a care-giver. It means that we do not own the goods; it means it is “on-loan” to us, and God is the “owner.” We are called by the Almighty to care for that which He entrusts to us.



Stewardship has become such a negative word in the life of the church as most of the time the focus is on finances and giving. Yet, our money resources are but one of the subjects of which God calls us to be good and faithful *caregivers*.

During the month of November, the weekend message series will center on a different aspect of stewardship (AKA: Care). For four consecutive weekends, we will drill down on: Care of our Souls, Care of the Needy, Care of our Resources, and Care of His Church. Each week will lead us to better understand our true role in what it means to care for that which God has temporarily given.

When I was a kid, my dad and I were going to cut the grass. The mower wouldn't start, so Dad told me to ask the next door neighbor, who was a good friend, if we could use his mower. He gladly gave us his mower to use. After we finished the lawn, Dad told me to clean up the mower, check the oil, and fill it with gas. I said, “Dad, it was dirty when we got it, and the tank was half empty.” Dad said, “We want to give it back in better shape than when it was given to us.”

Little did I know that this was an early lesson in what it means to care for our souls, the needy, our money, and the Church. May we be less independent, less entitled, less self-centered, less self-sufficient—and more responsive to the truth that our role and call is to be the *caregivers* of all that God has given us—and that means everything!

Devotion, Dessert, and Dancing


Plan on joining the fun and fellowship at the Golden Hub Community Center on Friday, November 11th.



CONGREGATIONAL FAST

The annual congregational invitation to *fast* is November 13-19. During this time you are invited to “try” the spiritual discipline of “doing without” something for the purpose of increasing your awareness of dependence on God! The Bible often speaks of “*praying and fasting*,” and often we utilize the prayer portion, but forego the *fasting*. Why?

One reason is that *fasting* is—so un-American! Who wants to “do without” anything? Yet *fasting* is as Biblical as prayer, worship, service, offering, and confession—all of which are spiritual vehicles designed to bring us in closer relationship to God. Jesus, Moses, David, Elijah, Esther, Daniel, and the whole congregation of Israel often *fasted* in order to seek the Lord by yearning for Him instead of filling themselves with physical items!

Fasting can take on any number of forms. Most commonly it is doing without food for one day a week, or even skipping a meal a day and substituting the meal time with feasting on God’s Word and prayer. *Fasting* could also take on other forms: doing without sweets, alcohol, cokes, technology, etc—all for the purpose of being more conscious of your need for God and depending less on the things of this world.

November and December are “high consumption” months and this is a great time to reel in our indulgences and practice moderation while focusing on God. Jesus says in Matthew 5, “*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.*” Try *fasting*—like prayer it can bring you closer to God!

Dual Rostering with LCMC

Our congregation council has been exploring the possibility of being rostered with both the NALC (which we currently are), and the LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ). Two compelling reasons to join are that it widens the pool of candidates for a pastor should Holy Ghost experience a pastoral vacancy, and it gives us a greater opportunity to work in partnership with area congregations, many being rostered as LCMC congregations. Theologically both church bodies align along similar lines. There is a bit of difference in structure; the NALC has a hierarchy and a small, but intentional international staff; the LCMC has a flat structure of an association of congregations linked together for a common purpose.

Joining is very simple. We would need to take a congregational vote requiring a 2/3 majority vote. Our constitution would need to be amended to reflect our dual affiliation. We would need to fill out an application with the LCMC following a successful vote, and then await the approval of their executive board. They hold no right to any property of the church. It remains with the congregation. They require no financial support, but we might find it prudent to lend some support to the association of churches to which we would be a part. And if Holy Ghost wanted to disassociate itself with the LCMC, it would take a 2/3 vote of the congregation to leave that church body.

Bi-Annual Congregational Meeting

The congregation will meet December 4th to: elect four new council persons; adopt a 2017 budget; hear a report on the annual North American Lutheran Church gathering; receive an update on the pastors’ role transition; and attend to other business. All confirmed members of the Church are voting members and invited to attend and be part of the business ministry.

What is Sepsis: Sepsis is the body’s overwhelming and life-threatening response to infection which can lead to tissue damage, organ failure, and death. Sepsis is the 3rd leading killer with more than 250,000 deaths per year.

Who it hurts: Sepsis is an equal opportunity killer impacting the sick, the well, and people of all ages.

Symptoms:
S-Shivering, fever (>101), or very cold (<97)

E-Extreme pain or general discomfort (“worst ever”)

P-Pale or discolored skin

S-Sleepy, difficult to rouse, confused

I-“I feel like I might die”

S-Short of breath (respiratory rate>20 per minute)

If you suspect sepsis (observe a combination of these symptoms) see your medical professional immediately, CALL 911, or go to the hospital ER with an advocate and say, “I am concerned about sepsis.” Every minute counts! Administration of antibiotics and IV fluids saves lives!

Wed., Nov. 23, Thanksgiving Eve: Our Stewardship emphasis surrounding thanksgiving, is being good stewards of Thankfulness. In Philippians 4:4-13 St. Paul reminds us of what it means to be thankful in any and all circumstances. This takes some effort and intentional living. Our challenge is to live our lives in constant thankfulness to God.

Sat. & Sun., Nov. 26 & 27: Stewardship (AKA: Care) of the Church. What are we doing with God’s Church? Do we treat it more like a museum to maintain the past, or more like a NASA launch pad to explore the future? Is it something more to preserve, or give away? Is it more of a club created for “members,” or more of a free commodity to “give away?” How you answer these questions is not important! What IS important is how God answers them—since it’s His Church! How are we at HGLC caring for God’s Church?
