## ***2017: An Opportunity for “Intentional Living: Choose A Life That Matters”***

Here is the perfect read for anyone/everyone in the New Year. Rev. John Maxwell’s latest book is titled “Intentional Living.” Maxwell has been a leader in the Christian Church for over forty years, and in that time he has ministered to millions of souls--- many by pastoring them in churches, others through church leadership conferences, and still more through the dozens of books he has authored.

I highly recommend “Intentional Living” for those who feel like they need a fresh start, renewed insights, alternate beginnings, or a changed perspective. Maxwell spoke to points in this book during the Global Leadership Summit which sixty-nine Holy Ghosters attended this summer and at which another sixty HGLC-ers served. After his presentation, his book literally flew off the shelves in the resource center, selling out. It offers simple but profound faith wisdom with respect to best utilizing the time God has given us. He delves into how we extract the best of life from our faith, serving, vocations, relationships, and even struggles.

The church staff is currently reading and discussing “Intentional Living” so that we might be more deliberate in our personal lives with family and friends, and while serving in the church office. It has proven to be a good exercise in the staff learning more about ourselves, each other, and what God intends for us in living the “abundant life” that Jesus describes in John 10. A few quote teasers that have caught my attention include:

“This book is not about creating a *perfect* life for you. It’s about wanting a *better* life for you.”

“Change can be difficult, but it becomes easier when you do it a little at a time.”

“Anybody can do their best. God helps us do better than our best.”

“Doing the right thing for the right reason with the right people—over time—gives you a huge significance return.”

“Have you ever been in a situation where you lost by winning?”

“Most people settle into one of three areas: survival, success, or significance.”

“Significance is always about others.”

“Change yourself before expecting change in others.”

“God room is the gap between what we can humanly accomplish and what can happen only if God helps.”

“Once you find your why, you will be able to find your way.”

“God gives purpose. Purpose gives meaning. Meaning gives hope and significance.”

Reading “Intentional Living” is a great way to launch into 2017. A book study will be offered beginning in February on Sunday mornings during the adult study hour. A few books will be made available for \$15, but used ones can be purchased on-line for less.

Begin the New Year in a more intentional way—get up, move, grow, build, discover—and live with greater purpose, meaning, and joy!

3. Four persons were elected to the church council: Carrie Culpepper, Jerry Christensen, Kathy Boos and Greg Henricksen .
4. Off-going council members were recognized and appreciated: Gil Becker, Mandy Herber, Robert Elder and Brian Eckert.
5. Robert Elder shared a report from the NALC convocation in August.
6. Pastors Bobby and David gave an update on the “pastoral roles” distinction between “lead pastor” and “shepherd pastor.”
7. A 2017 budget of \$825K was passed.
8. The congregation voted to dual affiliate as a congregation with LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ).
9. The 2017 church council was installed.
10. The meeting concluded by singing “Joy to the World.”

## Creation Care

*For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds?*  
 Luke 12: 23, 24 NRSV

In winter the birds in your backyard find a lot of their food from the seeds and berries of the plants and shrubbery. But they need more than they normally find. That is why it is important to feed the birds. I have listed a few tips below to assist you in attracting birds and caring for them:

- 1.) To attract many birds and create activity in your yard you should place feeders at different heights and locations. Place some feeders near trees and shrubs.
- 2.) The birds need shelter. Planting evergreen trees, bushes, vines and ground cover provides this shelter. Salvia and sage are good bushy plants and honey suckle are good vines to provide cover. Leaving up birdhouses is also a good idea.
- 3.) One should fill the feeders in the late afternoon. This is the ideal time for the birds to feed because it provides a boost before the birds settle in for the evening.
- 4.) Use some high fat seeds to help the birds. High fat provides energy. Suet cakes are good.
- 5.) Sprinkle some seeds on the bare ground for the birds that are ground feeders.

Hoping for a healthy 2017? Prevention is the best medicine! As you prepare your calendars for the new year, start planning when to make your appointments for your preventative health exams. Everyone should have a complete physical exam yearly, dental cleaning and exams twice a year, and some of us need yearly vision and eye exams. Check with your physician to make sure your immunizations (and those of your children) and age-appropriate screenings (such as mammograms, and colonoscopies) are up to date. Preventative services can find health problems early, when treatment works best, and can keep you from getting certain diseases.

Our emotional intelligence allows us to be responsible for our decisions. We can improve our emotional and mental health by writing in journals to express feelings, talking with friends, forgiving someone, reading, doing puzzles, creating something, learning new skills and nourishing relationships with family members and friends. Some benefits of improved emotional and mental health are more energy and a clearer mind.

Our spiritual health enables us to be connected to something greater than ourselves. You can improve your spiritual health by joining a Bible study or church group, attending church, praying daily, meditating, reading the Bible and memorizing uplifting quotes. Our spirituality gives us strength and support reminding us that when we are alone we are never *really* alone.

**“Come, let us worship the Lord!”**

**Sat. & Sun., Dec. 31 & Jan. 1:** Since the New Year falls over the weekend, we will combine our journey into this New Year with the journey that Jesus, Mary, & Joseph took in Matthew 2. What new journeys lie ahead for us in this New Year, in our faith, our lives, and our world?

**The New Year Sermon Series** is *“The Kingdom of heaven is like.....”* Each week in January and February will center on Jesus’ parables from Matthew 13. They give insight into how God works in this world and in the hearts of believers. Seven parables will explore the mystery of God in our lives.

**Sat & Sun, Jan. 7 & 8:** “The Kingdom of heaven is like.....” The new sermon series kicks off with a look at the medium Jesus primarily used to communicate the Gospel—parables. Jesus' parables are simple and memorable stories, often with imagery, that convey a message about God, Heaven, or faith.

**Sat. & Sun., Jan. 14 & 15:** “The Kingdom of heaven is like.... a farmer who planted seed.” This parable is recorded in three of the four Gospels making it one of the primary images that the followers of Jesus heard. It is a very important picture of how God works faith in the heart of people. Four soils are described. Many times we ask, “Which soil is in your heart?” The more appropriate point is “We have all these soils in our heart!”

**Sat. & Sun., Jan. 21 & 22:** The parable of the “Weeds” illustrates how faith and sin co-exist in the world and in our lives. Notice the weeds are not removed until “the end.” What might this mean for how we treat others whom we see as “weedy” people?

**Sat. & Sun., Jan. 28 & 29:** The Kingdom of Heaven is like . . . a Mustard Seed”, from Matthew 13:31-32. Jesus shares this story to teach us that no matter how small or insignificant we might feel, we can make an impact. God has given gifts to each of us and wants us to use them. When we use them in conjunction with God’s Kingdom purposes they can transform lives. How might you make an impact?




