Resurrection Hope

We celebrated the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on April 16 this year. What a celebration it was with the festive music, choir, children's message, awesome sermon on hope, along with a beautiful sunrise service in the West parking lot. Easter is filled with hope and joy, as the One who died on Good Friday, did just what He promised—rose again on the third day!

1 Peter 1:3 shares this about the resurrection, *"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."* Listen to those words, not just "hope," but a "living hope." We have a Savior who died, and yet death could not hold Him. The grave could not entomb Jesus because He is our living hope.

In September 1988, Hurricane Gilbert hit the Louisiana coast. At that time it was considered the "storm of the century." It battered the shoreline, severely disrupting the shrimping business. Many shrimp boats were lost, causing great concern for several families dependent on shrimping for their livelihood.

On the morning news there was an interview with a shrimp boat owner. He was asked how the storm would impact the shrimpers. With the devastation of Gilbert as a backdrop, this man said, "well, there is a good side, the storm will have stirred up the bottom of the ocean, making for better shrimping once we're able to get back out there."

In the midst of the death and destruction that such a powerful storm like a hurricane brings, this man was able to see the new life that awaited because of what the storm stirred up. Jesus faced many storms, some where he spoke and the wind and waves obeyed his voice to bring about a peaceful, calm sea. The greatest storm He faced was death on the cross. In the wreckage of his body beaten and pierced, there came new life. Jesus rose again, defeating the powers of sin, death, and the devil himself to win a great victory for us—a victory that brings hope to all who call on the name of Jesus.

No matter what storms may be blowing in your life right now, look to Jesus who is our rock and foundation who promises to guide us through every storm, so that we may see the sunny side of life.

Correct Posture

Sedentary activities such as sitting, reading, playing video games, and using a computer are often performed with poor posture. Poor posture can negatively impact a person’s health. Back problems and back pain are common results of poor posture. Slouching can cause jaw pain and headaches. Poor posture can also affect breathing and impair both the circulatory and digestive systems.

To improve posture when standing, keep your head held up, shoulders back and stomach tucked in. When sitting, keep the legs bent 90-120 degrees perpendicular to the floor, buttocks touching the back of the chair, with weight evenly distributed over both hips. Feet should be flat on the floor. Avoid sitting for long periods of time. Try to get up every 30 minutes. Exercise such as yoga and Pilates can assist in balancing the muscles of the body.

Advantages of good posture: extra height, fatigue prevention, less strain on body’s ligaments, and improved appearance.

SPRING GATHERING – The NALC South Texas Mission District Gathering was held April 8, 2017 at Welcome Lutheran Church at Brenham, Texas. The theme was Reformation, Refocus and Renewal. Eight ladies of Holy Ghost and three ladies from St. Paul of Cave Creek attended and the total in attendance was 166. A total of 155 Bibles were collected for the Prison Ministry. The monetary offering was \$1,475.00 for the WNALC Disaster Relief Fund.

BLOOD DRIVE – Women of Faith ladies hosted the South Texas Blood Drive April 10th. Thanks to the ladies for providing cookies and who gave their time as hostess.

LUTHERN WORLD RELIEF GATHERING – It was such an exciting day April 18, 2017, when 15 volunteers helped load the truck with Lutheran World Relief items to be delivered to Seguin. Holy Ghost members sent 561 quilts, 161 personal care kits, 53 baby care kits, 3 fabric kits, 103 pounds of soap and \$971.00 for shipping. The total for shipping will be published in June. Fourteen area churches brought their items to Holy Ghost for transporting to Seguin. Overall totals included 1,491 quilts, 545 personal care kits, 273 school kits, 105 baby care kits, 10 fabric kits, 182 pounds of soap and \$2,363.55 for shipping. We have an outstanding and giving congregation and we are forever grateful for your participation. A special thanks to the students of Kindernest for providing toothbrushes for the personal care kits. Also thanks to the ladies who provided cookies for refreshments. Also a **SPECIAL THANKS** to Kenneth and Barbara Sagebiel and Roslee and Kenneth Lochte for transporting these items to Seguin. The Women of Faith provided lunch.



Sat. & Sun., May 6 & 7: The 10:30am worship celebrates Confirmation Sunday for seventeen of our youth! They will share inspiring faith stories as each moves in a deeper faith walk. The Saturday, 6pm and Sunday, 8am will have a traditional service and message based on John 11:17-17 where Jesus proclaims that He is the “Resurrection and the Life!” Some death-bed stories will be shared where these powerful words brought hope, new life, and eternal life in the promises of God!

Sat. & Sun., May 13 & 14: It is Mother’s Day weekend and the Bible story from John 11 contains the shortest verse in the Bible: “Jesus wept!” The message will approach grief from the perspective of our God-given gift of tears and that “big boys DO cry!”

Sat. & Sun., May 20 & 21: Today we look at Jesus going to the tomb of His dear friend, Lazarus. Like the tomb that Jesus would be in, Lazarus’ tomb was sealed with a stone, and the stone had to be removed. What stones are entombing us? What stones need to be removed so that we may live the life that God intended us to live?

Sat. & Sun., May 27 & 28: We end our John 11 sermon series with Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Jesus shares an, “I told you so,” moment with Martha & us. This, “I told you so,” moment is about faith. Do we really believe in the resurrection? Do we really believe that Jesus has power over sin, death, and the devil? May we not doubt, but believe!


**Council News

Creation Care

For now the winter is past, and the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtle dove is heard in our land. Song of Solomon 2: 11-12 NRSV

As spring is upon us there are things we need to do in our gardens and yards to prepare for the flowers and song-birds so we can enjoy the beauty of nature through-out the year.

1. Be on the look-out for the hummingbirds and put out your nectar feeders.
2. Clean out last years' birdhouses for the new residents that will be looking to build a nest.
3. You need to fill your bird feeders daily with seeds and black oil sunflower seeds.
4. Finish your back yard cleanup. Remove any debris, rake your leaves and twigs.
5. Use your shears to remove any winter damage to your shrubs and trees.
6. Finish pruning your summer-flowering shrubs to encourage growth of the plants.
7. This is the time to be planting your spring and summer flowers.

Watch the news-paper for plant sales at your local nurseries and organizations such as the Master Gardeners, Native Plant Society, Garden Clubs and other associations. You can obtain high quality plants for your garden and yard at these various locations.
