I am still amazed as I think back to August 2016 when Holy Ghost Lutheran Church hosted the first Global Leadership Summit in FBG! It was held at the Hill Country University Center with 211 locals attending! There were sixty-two Holy Ghosters among that crowd, and in addition to those in the seats, another one-hundred-sixteen Holy Ghosters served in some capacity or another—totaling 178 persons from this congregation being directly involved in the event! In my humble opinion, that is a ground swell of souls! Other than weekly worship services and Sunday School attendance that occasionally goes over two-hundred, there is not another ministry/activity/program that involves that kind of number from our church!

We are committed to leading the community in this event again in 2017—and this year it's being held at the FBG High School Auditorium where the seating capacity is much larger and the chairs much softer! Again, fourteen top-notch world-class leaders from a variety of occupational disciplines will offer some of the best of the best in terms of learning, challenging, inspiration, team tools, and faith! People who attend have said that their leadership skills are elevated not only as an individual, but as a spouse, parent, team player, boss, business owner, employee, church member and community volunteer!

2017 community partner organizations with HGLC include: FISD, Hill Country Memorial Hospital, Allen Keller Co, Security State Bank, and First Baptist Church! Other groups that have a strong backing of participants attending are: First United Bank, Bethany Church, Double L Feed, Agri Tech, Oak Hills Church, Fischer & Wieser, Luckenbach, Heritage School, FBG Chamber of Commerce, City of FBG, and Mission de Candelilla. To date, 227 have registered and the number seems to grow daily! Of that number, forty-one Holy Ghosters have signed up and another fifty servant-volunteers are stepping up! God willing, this number will also increase!




“Enhancing & Maintaining a Healthy Marriage”

It has been said, “*marriages that work, are accomplished by couples who work at making them work!*”



It's that time of year when the produce section at HEB is packed with healthy, fresh, colorful, juicy fruits! Fruit is packed with fiber, antioxidants, and vitamins which can lower blood pressure, reduce risk of heart disease, prevent some types of cancer, and help digestion. Eat a variety of types and colors of fruit in order to give your body the mix of nutrients it needs. Fruits vary widely in their sugar content and while they are naturally

occurring sugars rather than the *added* kind, which makes a BIG difference, it is still helpful to be aware. Some fruits with low sugar content (<10g per serving) include strawberries, blackberries, blueberries, cantaloupe, watermelon, plums, grapefruit and peaches. Higher sugar contents (>12g per serving) are found in cherries, apples, bananas, grapes, figs, pineapples, and mango's.




A Living Will Forum?

SUMMER IN THE PSALMS!

The summer sermon series will grow from being planted in the Book of psalms! Fifteen psalms—some of your favorites and some that you may have never read will be the topics of the weekend messages. Summer is also a perfect time to begin a new spiritual endeavor—like reading through the Psalms, taking one a day to reflect upon devotionally.

Sat. & Sun. July 1 & 2: Psalm 95 is a Psalm of Thanksgiving mentioning that emphasizes that God is our “great King above all gods!” The message will center on the fact that there are many “gods” or idols, but God is the King of all gods, so may our allegiance, faith and behavior be in Him above all others!

Sat. & Sun., July 8 & 9: Psalm 3 is a lament offering human worry before the One who can actually do something about it—God Almighty! The Jews had a special physical place to bring their cries and concerns—it was called the “Wailing Wall.” What makes you “wail” these days? Such a wall will be in place as we come to communion also bringing our “wailings” to the Lord?

Sat. & Sun., July 15 & 16: Psalm 27 is the psalm of the week and “Take Courage” is the message. Pastor Jan Unger will preach the Word this weekend as we again are blessed to hear from one of the HGLC Visitation Ministers.

Sat. & Sun., July 22 & 23: Psalm 13 is a lament psalm which expressed deep pain, disappointment, and even fear. The subject will be the anguish of suicide that must go on inside a person’s heart who considers such, as well as the tremendous grief that survivors are left with in its aftermath. Communion will be served to bring us God’s light in our darkness. Names of our loved ones may be brought to the “Wailing Wall” as people come for communion.

Sat. & Sun., July 29 & 30: Psalm 139 is the focus of our message. In this Psalm human vulnerability is exposed as we hear that the God who made us also knows everything there is to know about us—even what goes on inside our hearts! All three worships will be “Song-Fests” offering many of our favorite of favorites!



You shall not pollute the land in which you live; for blood pollutes the land, and no expiation can be made for the land, for the blood that is shed in it, except by the blood of the one who shed it. The Texas Hill Country has one of the most picturesque and beautiful landscapes in Texas. With the hills, wildflowers and the open fields with livestock and exotic animals it provides a very peaceful and tranquil scene when we drive down our country roadways. Unfortunately litter and trash often mar this beauty. Our local Missions Team is working with the Texas Highway Department to rectify this along a two mile stretch of Highway 87 South of Fredericksburg by having trash pickup days. Numerous people have been supporting this effort by helping pick up trash in the ditches.

There are some certain facts about litter that most of us do not realize about the decomposition of materials:

1. Styrofoam containers take more than 1 million years.
2. Plastic jugs take 1 million years.
3. Plastic bags take 5000 to 1000 years.
4. Disposable diapers take 500 years.
5. Aluminum cans take 200 to 500 years.
6. A banana peel takes 3 weeks to 5 years.


