## ***"Healthy Neglect?"***

I've observed some "healthy neglect" here at Holy Ghost Lutheran Church over the summer, and that is a fantastic thing!

I'm not exactly sure where I picked up this phrase—whether it was in a parenting class or in an article on teaching children—but it is a notion that has stuck. The idea is that our kids learn from a combination of parent teaching methods. One of these styles is that they learn as we "model" certain behaviors for them-- they learn to do things as they see us doing them. For example, our children learned to tie their shoes as they observed Tammy and I tying our shoes and then our instructing them to tie their own shoes.

The problem with exclusively practicing "modeling" for our children is that it limits the child's learning as parents tend to do things "for" them—thus they only learn in part—they learn "about" tying shoes, but they don't learn "how" to tie their own shoes, especially if the parent continues to tie their shoes! And as long as a parent "over-functions" for his child, the child under-functions. (I recently heard a story about a single middle-age man who still does not do his own laundry because his 70 year old mother does it for him). When our children only observe our teaching, and we continue to do the things they could do for themselves, they tend to let us keep doing those things for them... until we practice a little "healthy neglect"-- and this is another way that our children learn.

When parents model to children "how to" do certain things, and then step aside, allowing them to do the task—at times imperfectly, often not like we would do it-- they learn to do it themselves. They try and sometimes fail, but along the way, they grow, mature and take ownership. Normal chores like cooking, washing dishes, cleaning their room, doing laundry, using a credit card, fueling their car—are building blocks to stepping up, taking greater responsibility and appropriately functioning. When a parent steps back to create space for this, it is called "healthy neglect" (Note: "unhealthy neglect" would be failing to do things that put a child in danger, at risk, or in awkward positions).

I've had opportunity to practice some "healthy neglect" this summer with Pastor David's being on sabbatical. With him away for three months, it would be quite easy for me to "over-function" and try to do the work of two pastors, fill all the roles, holes, and areas of leadership. And, if I were to "over-function," I would be the reason for others to "under-function!" Instead, you have stepped up because the pastor does not always need to be the one who prays before or after a gathering. The pastor is not the one who has to lead the team meeting or even attend it. The reverend is not the one who has to create the agenda.

A great example has been the Adult Sunday School opening devotion. I announced at the beginning of the summer that with one pastor down, I would not be doing the general opening devotion that the pastors normally rotate leading on Sundays prior to the classes. I mentioned that if we were going to have opening devotions this summer, we would need some individuals to do it. After the first week, zero signed up. It seemed that no one took me seriously, so I announced it again the next week. Three people signed up. The following week, I shared that we would only have three devotions during the summer. That week, all thirteen spots got filled! And what an experience it has been—hearing heartfelt personal faith reflections from those who have had it modelled to them for many years without ever being asked to do it!

I think we'll keep practicing some "healthy neglect" during adult Sunday School devotions well after this pastoral sabbatical ends! It's how it's supposed to be—not with the pastors "doing" the ministries for the church, but modeling and then challenging others to do the ministry of the church! At times, I ask, "*How many ministers do we have at church today?*" The answer is—all of us! We are all called by Jesus in faith to lead, follow, and grow in areas of serving. The purpose is so that we multiply ministry and "Be disciples"—the active participants—that Jesus calls us to be as opposed to having someone do it for us!

Jesus practiced "healthy neglect" when He ascended into heaven, leaving His disciples to take His lead, lean on Him, figure it out, grow, mature and "Make" more disciples. So, anticipate our finding more places where we might get out of your way, practice "healthy neglect," and allow the ministers to minister!

May we be led to lead & fed to feed! +Pastor Bobby





1. Tricia Herrera led the devotion for the evening and opened with prayer.
2. The Strategic Planning Team gave a report with respect to the building program and use of the Creek St. and Klaerner House properties. As a direction is foreseen, the congregation will have info forthcoming in the fall).
3. Bids for repairing the exterior balcony at 110 E. Creek St. are being received.
4. A “furnishings sale” is being planned for the unused contents in the Creek St. homes.
5. Conversation with Ambleside School is in process with respect to their high school classes utilizing parsonage #2 (former Vitek home).
6. Don & Dianne Gardner transferred their church membership to St. Peter’s Lutheran Church, Sheboygan, WI.
7. Two reps from each of the following teams will serve on the Budget Team: Resource Management (Peggy Matli, Mandy Herber), Stewardship (Linda Christensen, Jason Helfrich), and Council (Chuck Jenschke, Carrie Culpepper). June Woerner, the church financial officer, and Paul Lochte, church financial historian, will also serve on the Budget Team.

**Creation Care**

*The Lord God appointed a bush, and made it come up over Jonah, to give shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort, so Jonah was very happy about the bush. But when dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that attacked the bush, so that it withered. When the sun rose, God prepared a sultry east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint and asked that he might die. He said, “It is better for me to die than to live.” Jonah 4: 6-8 NRSV*

As Jonah appreciated the bush while it existed, so do we appreciate the coolness of our homes or our places of business to save us from the sweltering heat that Jonah experienced. There are things that we can do to stay cool and save money on air conditioning electricity costs.

1. If you have not already done so, have a trained air conditioning service technician check and service your air conditioning units if needed. A fully-tuned air conditioning unit operates at its peak efficiency.
2. It is recommended that you set your thermostat at a minimum of 78 degrees when you are home and higher when you leave. A programmable thermostat works well for this. This allows you to save the most electricity.
3. The use of a ceiling fan when you enter and occupy a room helps to move air that cools the room. Then when you leave the room the fan should be turned off.
4. Your drapes and shades should be closed on sunny days to help keep the heat from entering your room. On shady days you can open the drapes and shades to allow natural light in.
5. It is recommended that you grill outside as much as you can on the hot summer days rather than use your oven to help keep your kitchen cooler. You can also serve cold dishes, order take-out or delivery, and heat food dishes up in the microwave.

**Volunteers Needed for Creek Street Properties Tag Sale!!**

Immediately after HGLC purchased the houses/properties at 108 and 110 E. Creek Street, a massive number of volunteers showed up to cut trees, trim bushes, haul off exterior trash! What an initial response it was as 50-60 answered the bell by giving their time and efforts!

*NOW an even larger response* is needed as the church turns its attention to the inside of the houses! The former owner donated many furniture and household items. A team was organized to sort through every item, save items that could be utilized, and discard trash. For the items that the church will not keep, a “big sale” will be held with proceeds going toward paying down the debt.


The team is asking the congregation: *“Is there an ample number of HGLC volunteers willing to commit toward holding a two-day “tag sale” so that the church can retain all of the proceeds?”* The option to the church’s holding a “tag sale” would be to hire an auctioneer who does all the work but charges 30-40%.

In order for HGLC to accomplish the “tag sale,” committed volunteers will be necessary! Some persons will be needed prior to the actual sale. Beginning in August that would include: dishwashers, furniture cleaners and polishers, volunteer coordinators, pricing coordinators, taggers of sale items, organizers and displayers, photographers, persons to post to the church website, advertisers, and furniture movers. For the two days of the “tag sale,” volunteers would be needed as cashiers, sales assistants, security monitors, parking assistants, furniture movers, worker refreshment crew, and cleanup group.

***Will you help the church save the 30- 40% which will go toward the debt payment?*** If we are unable to recruit the required number of people by August 13<sup>th</sup>, the plan is to turn the sale over to a professional auctioneer company.
