## **2018: Refuge, Seas, & Fields of Faith!**

I had a meaningful conversation with a colleague who lives in another city. She shared that she had spent some time reflecting on Scripture and exploring what God might want her to do in 2018. She explained that as she was reading certain parts of the Bible, the image of a “refuge” kept surfacing. The Word of God often uses “refuge” to speak about God, for example Psalm 46 says, “*God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in times of trouble.*” The word refuge connotes “safety, comfort, protection.”

She went on to say, as she thought more deeply about this image, it was as if God’s refuge was a fortress at the edge of the ocean. From that place of refuge He would send her out onto the ocean where, at times, the water was deep and the waves tempestuous like it was for Peter walking on the water.

She said God would then bring her back to the refuge for a period of respite, but only to be sent out again—this time the pastures & fields behind the fortress. It was there that she found some of God’s greatest treasures, as told by Jesus in the parable of the person who found “*a pearl of great price in a field, and upon discovering the priceless gift, the person went and sold everything he had in order to purchase the land and possess the pearl.*” She sensed that this image was God inviting her to sacrifice for His Kingdom. He would then bring her back to the refuge—only to again send her out on the rough sea or back to the field for more sacrifice.

She continued by saying that the place she really wanted to be was in the refuge where she was safe, comfortable, and protected but was also quick to infer that the refuge is not where God would have us stay for very long.

It seems for many of us, we’d like 2018 to be a year of safety, comfort, and protection—for God to take us in and be our permanent place of refuge. And yet, hopefully we are mature enough in our faith that we know He does give us refuge, strength, calm, and peace at times---and though this is the place where we as humans want to be all the time, this is not to be our perpetual residence.

Rather, God calls us to the high seas and on choppy waters where we might live by faith and have to depend on Him more than ourselves. He also calls us to places of sacrifice for Him and for the sake of the Kingdom for the very same reasons-- that we might again live by faith and depend on Him more than on ourselves.

I believe that the image God gave this colleague is the image He gives to all of us as He calls us not to live lives of comfort & shelter, but to live lives of faith, trust, and sacrifice. I pray that 2018 would begin with each of us seeing God as our Refuge, but just like when Peter wanted to stay on the mountain where Jesus was transfigured—(Peter wanted to make a lasting “dwelling place” to remain in that glorious place)—yet Jesus led him back down the mountain to the valleys, shadows, challenges, and darknesses of life which require greater faith.

In this new year, may you find refuge in God, AND may you find yourself on the seas surrounded by wind and waves, as well as in the fields of life making sacrifices for Jesus, only to be taken into God’s refuge again, only to be sent out again! May this be the pattern of faith as we seek to grow in trust, love, and obedience to the Will of God in 2018.

Amen?

Safety and security measures have been taken at HGLC in response to the tragedy at the Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs. Officer Chris Ayala led a seven-hour training session attended by eighty plus persons from various churches in our community, eighteen of whom were HGLC persons. HGLC is putting together a security strategy to create greater awareness and safety for the HGLC campus. Steve Olfers is heading up this effort. The greatest thing the average worshipper can do is be more aware of their surroundings, know where the exits are, and be ready to act if or when the times comes. These measures are important not only for situations like Sutherland Springs, but also for fires, gas leaks, or long sermons! Questions and ideas may be directed toward Steve.



**Special Offering for January: Funeral Meals!**



One of the tremendous ministries that happens at HGLC is offering a meal for the loved ones of a family member whose funeral was just conducted. This ministry brings the family members and close friends together for a time of personal sharing, food, fellowship, and faith prior to their departing. Historically the church has called upon members to supply sandwiches, cakes, and cookies. But as times have changed, the church needs to change the way this ministry is done. With fewer phone calls being returned from messages left, and with stricter county/community food regulations related to hygiene, it is time to make a shift.

## JANUARY WORSHIP THEMES

**Sat. & Sun., Jan 27 & 28:** Treasures, what are they? And where should I invest my time and energy? In Being and Making Disciples, God gives us treasures to help us grow in our faith and service to God. These treasures can be found in our G.R.A.C.E.D. acronym.

### Creation Care

*Comfort, O comfort my people, says the Lord. Isaiah 40: 1 NRSV*

Winter with its colder weather is coming. It is time to think about the things that can make our home more comfortable for us. There are a few things we can do for little or no cost. We all know that our heating system needs to be checked and serviced if necessary, but there are other things we can do to conserve heat and save electricity.

1. Running your ceiling fans slowly will circulate the heat that rises to the ceiling.
2. Add weatherstripping or caulk around doors and windows if there is an air leak.
3. If you have furniture or rugs that cover or block floor vents, they should be moved.
4. Install a smart thermostat that can regulate the temperature while away or in bed.
5. Keep the shades open during the day to allow sunlight to heat the interior of your home.
6. Run your clothes dryer and dishwasher after dark because they produce additional heat.
7. Install compact fluorescent or LED lights to conserve electricity.
8. Check the seams and joints of your ductwork for air leaks.
9. Conserve hot water by washing clothes in cold water and taking shorter showers.


