Remembering the Past—Living in the Present

Holy Ghost Lutheran Church will celebrate seventeen decades, that's One hundred seventy (170) years of ministry in Gillespie County this October. Psalm 8 begins with a word of celebration, pointing to the Almighty God as Sovereign Lord over all the heavens and the earth. "*O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth!*" We give praise and thanksgiving to God for these seventeen decades of existence as a church. It is but a small drop in comparison to all that God has done. When one considers all the lives that have been touched over the years, baptisms, confirmations, weddings, anniversaries, and yes even end of life celebrations; it is amazing how God's grace continues to abound and the Gospel is being shared.

Leonard Sweet, theologian and author, taught a series a few years back that dealt with essential leadership for moving the church into today's fluid culture. In one session on traditions, He used the analogy of an anchor representing the past and talked about casting it into the future to pull ourselves along. His point was to build on the rich history of faith that past saints have died to defend, to cast that tradition forward using it as a foundation to build even greater things.

At Holy Ghost we have seventeen decades of rich history as a foundation to accomplish great things for the continued work of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Our anniversary offering goal is to raise \$1,000 for each of those decades (\$17,000) to build on those traditions and cast the anchor of faith forward.



There are two great opportunities for us. 1) To partner with the historic Black Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, in the restoration of their facility on Main Street in Fredericksburg. It is an important part of the history and tradition of this community; and 2) To be mission-minded in spreading the Gospel into places where it is forbidden by law to be preached. Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, Mission Director for the North American Lutheran Church, is working on a television ministry, by broadcasting the Gospel into the Middle East. It is important for us to cast that anchor of rich faith before us, so that it may be foundational for others in faith formation and the saving work of Jesus Christ. You are encouraged to give as the Lord has richly blessed us in these endeavors.

We encourage you to bring family, friends, neighbors and guests with you to the Celebration of the 170th Anniversary of Holy Ghost Lutheran Church. The date is Sunday, October 9. The place is the Gillespie County Fairgrounds. Sunday School and fellowship activities will begin at 9:00 am, along with a historical presentation. A festive worship will follow at 10:30, when Rev. Mark Chavez, General Secretary of the NALC, will bring the Word, and the Boerne Village Band will bring the music. All will be followed by the biggest and best pot-luck meal in the county. Meat will be provided by the church. All others are asked to bring a family-sized side dish and/or dessert.

As the psalmist says, "*Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever!*"

Creation Care

You make springs gush forth in the valleys; they flow between the hills, giving drink to every animal; the wild asses quench their thirst. By the streams the birds of the air have their habitation. From your lofty abode you water the mountains; the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your work. Psalm 104: 10, 11, 12, 13, NRSV

One of your home’s largest energy users is your refrigerator. There are several things you can do to insure it is running as efficiently as possible.

1. Keep the refrigerator level so the door closes tightly.
2. Check the door gaskets to insure the door closes tightly with no air leakage.
3. A refrigerator should be full. It operates much more efficiently when it is full. If you do not have enough food to fill the refrigerator, add gallons of water to be 2/3 full. One should not stuff the refrigerator so air cannot circulate around the food. That is why the 2/3 full is a good guideline. Do the same with your freezer, using bags of ice if it is not full.
4. Food should be cooled before being put in the refrigerator. Putting hot food in the refrigerator can raise the internal temperature and make it work harder to compensate for the heat.
5. Cover the food being put into the refrigerator. Uncovered food releases moisture that causes the compressor to work harder.
6. A refrigerator should not be located in the sunlight or next to the stove. These situations cause the refrigerator to work harder to keep the food cool.
7. The refrigerator needs room on the sides and the top to allow ventilation around the unit.
8. The coils should be cleared of dust and dirt under and behind the unit.

The Manner of Giving Sacrificially

“Jesus looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the offering box, ² and he saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. ³ And he said, “Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them. ⁴ For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on.” (Luke 21:1-4)

Sacrifice. Does this word conjure up an image of a lamb or a goat being slain and offered on an Old Testament altar? Or do you see Jesus on the cross—the ultimate sacrifice of all time? Do you think of the time you gave up that fishing trip to take your wife to the mall? Or do you remember the time you passed up lunch with a friend to accompany 30 first graders on an all-day field trip?

Sacrifice hits us where we live. Whether it be time, service, assets, or money, it requires us to give up something we hold dear. Why is sacrifice difficult? We are prone to an attitude of entitlement. Our society encourages individualism and success, often at the expense of others. The first step in becoming a truly sacrificial giver is to recognize that all we have comes from God and belongs to Him. Without Him, we would have nothing. A second step to being able to give as this widow did is overcoming our fear of not being able to provide for ourselves and our loved ones. Giving beyond our means, however, is not to be confused with living beyond our means. As seen in this example and in the example of the widow who provided for Elijah (1 Kings 17) and never ran out of flour and oil, when we give all we have back to God, He will provide for us beyond our wildest imagination.

Let’s take God at His word. We’ve seen how He blesses those who give from a heart that recognizes the great sacrifice God made for us and that we can trust Him enough to provide all we need. Can we love and trust God that much?

Sat. & Sun., Oct 15 & 16: This weekend we begin a short sermon series based on key elements in our understanding of scripture as both Law and Gospel. Today we focus on the Law, what it means to conform. What is the Job of the Law? And how might it point us to Christ?

Sat. & Sun., Oct. 23 & 24: “Transform” is the word of the week as God seeks to shape us into living in the image of Himself in word and deed. A "Food Handler" shall be defined as a person who prepares, cooks, or serves food or drinks for consumption by the public.






COUNCIL NOTES
