A Time for . . .!

Time is a precious commodity. We only have twenty-four hours in each day, or one thousand four hundred forty minutes. It may appear to be enough time for everything we want to accomplish. If you are like me, you quickly discover that the day is nearly ended, your list is still long, and your flesh is tired and weak. Your body screams sleep, but your mind races with the best of the Nascar drivers, around and around a never-ending track.

In Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, the theme for our Lenten devotional and Lenten journey this year, the writer speaks to us and communicates that there is “*a time for every matter under heaven.*” There is quite an extensive list of subject matter which he shares—a time for birth, death, planting, harvesting, mourning, dancing, love, hate, war, and peace. Our detailed list for the grocery store, running the kids to soccer, basketball, 4-H, dance, the honey-do list, not to mention that all the details of our work; have not even made the list. We get so caught up in the daily grind of things that we don’t have time for anything else.



I have been fortunate on several occasions to step back, if you will, and get a perspective from the bleachers to see that it doesn’t have to be this way. Instead of getting caught up in time, we need to make time for what is important. On retreats like ACTS, Via De Cristo, or Emmaus weekends, you put away your watch and cell phone and focus on being on God’s time. When Joyce and I traveled to Germany and Austria seventeen years ago, we discovered that Europeans are a bit more laid back than us Americans. They still work hard but take intentional time for themselves and their families. They have learned to balance their time. By far the most memorable experience was my trip to Ethiopia in 2012. I discovered that people invested their time in other people and didn’t let deadlines control them. Often there were no set times for events. Worship was that way. It might be set for 10:00 am, but it almost never started at 10am. They waited for people to gather, and while waiting, people visited with one another, caught up with each other, prayed with each

other. Worship itself had no time limit, often being three to four hours in length—but it was not boring. Songs were sung, people were prayed over for healing, several people might share an inspirational story or message of how God had touched their life. When worship ended, people didn’t disburse. That was when meals were prepared, children played, friendships were strengthened, and more faith was shared.

In all his wisdom, and that was the greatest gift God gave to Solomon who wrote Ecclesiastes; Solomon knows how precious time truly is and knows what it is to have squandered or wasted time. He encourages us to set aside or make time for what is important and to put everything in the proper perspective. I encourage you during this Lenten journey to set aside time for worship, for studying and reading God’s Word, for prayer, for spending quality time with your family and friends, as well as time serving others in the name of Jesus. God created time; may we be good stewards of it.

The meeting was held on Feb. 12 with ninety-two persons attending. The HGLC Trust Fund interest was distributed by the congregation voting to give 55% to the Fields of Faith (local); 22% to the Global Leadership Summit Prison Sites (regional); and 21% to Heifer International (global).

Other business included:

1. The Investment Team membership proposal to have up to 9 members was ratified.
2. An update on the Creek Street property was given.
3. The financial review team reported the books were in good order.
4. A report on the ministry relationship with St. Paul, Cave Creek was given.
5. The December congregational meeting was set for Dec. 10.

Creation Care

Who spread out the earth on the waters, for his steadfast love endures forever; who made the great lights, for his steadfast love endures forever; the sun to rule over the day, for his steadfast love endures forever; the moon and stars to rule for night, for his steadfast love endures forever. Psalms 136: 6 – 9 NRSV.

When one considers Going Green, one has many choices: from buying energy-efficient light bulbs to buying a net zero home to conserve energy. If you make just one change a year, your energy bill can be reduced, become more efficient, and save natural resources. I have included five considerations:

1. Replace your old incandescent light bulbs and fixtures with LED light fixtures. LED lights use 75% less energy and can last up to 10 years before replacement.
2. If you have a refrigerator, heating/air-conditioning unit, or washing machine that is over 10 years old, it may be using excess energy. When you decide to replace them, look for the Energy Star label. These appliances are designed to the most stringent government standards for energy efficiency.
3. Most homes use more water than needed. This can be reduced by turning off the faucet while brushing your teeth and shaving and by taking shorter showers. If you install low-flow faucets and toilets, you will save additional water.
4. As homeowners, we have opportunities to choose sustainable or energy-efficient products over ones that are less environmentally friendly. Consider this: when you purchase cleaning products and items wrapped in a lot of plastic, it will go to the landfill. In remodeling, use durable products that will last many years and materials that are from renewable sources and grown in sustainable forests.
5. Install a programmable thermostat to automatically adjust your home's temperature during the night-time hours and when you are not home. Newer thermostats allow you to use your smart-phone to make changes if your schedule changes.

7 Incredible Results You'll Get from Walking

1. Improve your mood – You know how it sometimes takes a beer, glass of wine or square (or three) of chocolate to blunt the edge of a rough day? Well, going for a walk is a zero calorie strategy with the same benefits! What's more, when you make your walks social with your partner, friend or neighbor – that connection helps you feel connected which boosts your mood! How about a walking Bible study?! Walking outdoors also exposes you to natural sunlight which is a good antidote to the blues.
2. Your creative juices will start flowing – Research shows that going for a walk helps relieve feeling stuck at work or home and aids problem solving! So instead of counting to ten, walk for ten (minutes).
3. Your jeans will get a little looser – This one seems obvious, but it's a happy benefit for those who start walking regularly. This is because walking improves your body's response to insulin, which helps reduce body fat. It also increases metabolism by burning extra calories and by preventing muscle loss. Even walking just under a mile a day can decrease body fat by 2% in a month!
4. You'll slash your risk of chronic disease – The stats are impressive. Walking lowers your blood sugar levels and overall risk for diabetes, lowers blood pressure, and may reduce your risk of stroke by 20-40%. Walking 30 minutes a day 5 days a week can lower your risk of cardiovascular disease by 30%.
5. You'll keep your legs looking great – Walking is a proven way to prevent unsightly varicose veins from developing. If you already suffer from varicose veins, walking can help ease related swelling and restlessness.
6. You'll start to get more "regular" - Regular walking can greatly improve gastric motility because it utilizes core and abdominal muscles, encouraging movement in the GI system.
7. Your other goals will start to seem more reachable – When you become a regular walker, you will have established a regular routine and will be more likely to not only continue with the activity but also take on new healthy behaviors.

WORSHIP IN MARCH

*Saturday, 6:00pm offers an informal service;
Sunday, 8:00am is a traditional service; and

"Come, let us worship the Lord!"

The Lenten sermon series is titled " *There is a time for everything....*" Each weekend and each midweek Lenten service will focus the message on Ecclesiastes 3. All services will be in the church this year. Morning 11 services will be traditional, and evening 6:30 services will include a drama followed with a brief message.

Wed. March 1: Ash Wednesday services will be held at 11:00 am & 6:30 pm with ashes and communion. The theme will follow the passage from Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, a time for every matter under heaven. The theme will begin with, "A time to be born, and a time to die". Jesus will be on trial throughout the Lenten season as various witnesses are brought forward. Invite friends and family to join us for the Lenten Journey.

Sat. & Sun., March 4 & 5: This is the first weekend in Lent, and the theme from Ecclesiastes 3 continues with, "A time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted." Planting and harvesting are common themes in the Bible, and Jesus uses the parables to teach us about sowing the seed of His Word. The harvest indeed is plentiful, but the laborers are few.

Wed., Mar. 8: "A time to kill and a time to heal" will explore the hard choices that involve life and death decisions. War, divorce, relational division will be the subjects of the micro-message after the evening drama.

Sat. & Sun., Mar. 11 & 12: "A time to break down and a time to build up" will focus on the healing that happens when we allow God to break us down and build us back up.

Wed., Mar. 15: "A time to weep and a time to laugh" takes a refreshing look at the new life God gives us now in this life—not waiting to celebrate that newness just in heaven, but here on earth.

Sat. & Sun., March 18 & 19: The focus verse this weekend is, "A time to mourn, and a time to dance." Psalm 30 reminds us that our mourning is turned into dancing. At the time of a loved one's death, we feel the keen sting of death with all its sorrow and pain. In the midst of death, we are reminded of the Resurrection of our Lord and the promise He made to all who believe. That promise gives us hope and something to celebrate even in the midst of death.

Wed. March 22: The emphasis is on throwing and gathering stones. What stones need to be discarded in our lives? And what stones do we need to build upon to live a life of purpose and intentionality? We look at what Jesus said about the Temple in Matthew 24:1-2.

Sat. & Sun., Mar. 25 & 26: Ecclesiastes 3:5b, shares, "*A time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing.*" Being a Christian often puts us at odds with the world in which we live. What behaviors do we need to refrain from that turn us away from God? And what characteristics should we embrace so that we might be an example for Christ in our daily lives?

Wed., Mar. 29: "A time to seek and a time to lose" is the language of restoration and redemption. Is there a "black sheep" that you could help bring back into the fold? Who is lost that needs to be found? God is sure you know someone!
