HOPE

As the Christmas season dawns upon us, with thoughts of "children nestled all snug in their beds, while visions of sugar-plums danced in their heads;" (wait, what's a sugar-plum?) It is hard not to think of all those fine, fun traditions that bring smiles to our faces and put joy in our hearts. As people of Christian faith, we have even stronger traditions that are foundational for our faith. While society skips ahead with "Deck the Halls" and "Jingle Bells," we enter into a time of preparation—the pre-Christmas season we call Advent. For what are we preparing? The season of Advent prepares us for the incarnation—to receive not only the Christ-Child, but the fullness of who Jesus is into our lives. It is a time of renewing our commitment and focus on the One who not only was born but who entered this world so that He might take our place on the cross of Good Friday, to die for our sins, and on Easter to rise, victoriously fulfilling the promises and hopes of people of all generations, even those yet to come, with the gift of eternal life! That is hope!

Hope does not come upon us by accident. It was built into God's master plan of salvation. The pre-Christmas story in Luke chapter 1 is worth reading at this season of the year. It begins by telling us of the story of a humble priest named Zachariah and his wife Elizabeth who faithfully served in the temple. Both were up in years and childless.



(Wait, is this the more modern but still ancient story of Abraham and Sarah?) As faithful and dedicated as they were to God, being of a well-matured age, Zachariah was just a bit hesitant, shall we say when the angel Gabriel announced they were going to have a son. Zachariah was silenced for his hesitation, until such time as his son, John (aka John the Baptist) was born. Luke 1:67 – 80 records Zachariah's song of prophecy when his tongue is loosened. Here is just a part of that song which speaks of the One who prepares the way for the Lord. "You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare His way, to give His people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those

who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace." The story of John the Baptist is recorded in all four Gospels (Matthew 3, Mark 1, Luke 3, and John 1). He came to give people a wake-up call that the Messiah was coming. Repent and believe! It was simple, to the point, and with appropriate challenge.


The message is still simple and to the point. Perhaps the challenge for us today, while not totally rejecting the culture in which we live, is discovering how we can be in the world but not of the world. How might we cut through the commercialism that has become our modern day Christmas so that we can focus on the One for whom Christmas was named in the first place—Christ Jesus our Lord?

Here are some suggestions for Keeping Christ in Christmas. Spend time with your family reading from Luke chapter 1, how God prepares us to receive Christ, and all the pieces that God put together to make that happen. Take time out of your busy day to spend in prayer, thanking God for the gift of Jesus. Pray also for those who struggle with the season of Christmas; those in grief, those with family struggles, those still recovering from hurricane or fire damage, those who are still reeling from the horror of mass shootings. A couple of families have shared that instead of getting each other lavish gifts, they buy gifts and adopt a needy family for Christmas. Others choose to simply gather and treasure time with family. Others gather as family to come and worship together. Before you share your Christmas dinner, pause to read the Christmas story from Luke 2:1-20, and give thanks not only for your daily bread, but for the most precious Christmas gift of all time—the Gift of Jesus!

May God bless us in this upcoming "Holy" day season! Pastor David

A Word from the Stewardship Team:

Required Minimum Distribution

The dreaded RMD is the requirement from the IRS that once we reach the age of 70 1/2, we must take distributions from our IRA, SEP, Simple, or retirement account. In most cases, this results in taxable income to add to the tax return in the year of the distribution. But wait! There is an exception! The IRS allows you to make a tax-free transfer to a charity of your choice from your retirement account. You don't need to itemize deductions to get the tax benefit. Making a tax-free transfer also keeps the money out of your gross income. That could help you avoid the Medicare high-income surcharge in certain tax brackets. Keeping money out of your adjusted gross income could also make less of your Social Security benefits taxable. Do you have an RMD this year? Talk to your accountant and your broker to see if you can designate some of the required amount paid to the charity of your choice.

For example:

Required Minimum Distribution

\$5,000

Check from broker payable to the charity of your choice \$1,000

Taxable distribution for 2017 to your return \$4,000

The message will explore what it means to be respond to negative news in a positive way as opposed to the way people might normally react. The Choirs will offer several seasonal songs as a tribute to the King of Kings!

Sat. & Sun., Dec 16 & 17: In our Christmas Journey, we focus on the Phrase, "Do Not Fear!" told to Joseph, to Mary, and to the Shepherds, as the angels appeared to them. Christmas Day, Mon., Dec. 25 at 9am: When angels sing, we need to listen to what they have to say and join in the song. Luke 2:14 is the focus for Christmas day, as the story of Jesus' birth is shared for the first time by a host of angels singing a heavenly chorus. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it! Hallelujah!

Sat. & Sun., Dec. 30 & 31: Eight days after Jesus was born, he was taken to the Temple for a dedication. The story says the priest "took him in his arms." It is in Jesus' coming to us that, by faith, we too are invited to take him not only into our arms but into our hearts!

Security Measures: We are reminded by the 1st Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs tragedy that the Church on earth is not exempt from the ills of sin, Satan, violence and darkness. This incident has led all churches to be more aware of the need for greater security. HGLC leaders have already taken some immediate steps to help provide stronger security. In addition a team has been assembled to create a more definite strategy for church participant protection. Here are a few things each of us can do:

- a. <u>Don't panic</u> or become paranoid to the degree that fear leads you to not attend worship. Hundreds of people die in car accidents every day and yet all of us continue to drive. Besides, we will not Satan take away our freedom to worship! We are a resurrection people!
- b. Be more <u>aware of your surroundings</u>. Again, not to be paranoid of persons that you may not know, but definitely <u>be</u> aware!
- c. Know where the <u>exits</u> are in case of any emergency (gas leak, fire, etc) that would need you to evacuate the building quickly.
- d. <u>Pray!</u> Pray for the people in Sutherland Springs. Pray for the whole Church! Pray for HGLC! And, let us further pray that we as a Church may discover gospel-ways to be help persons along the way of life so that they do not get to the place where they deal out such destruction and harm.
