Being & Making Disciples!

"Our Need for Healing; Our Need for the Great Physician"

Is there any among us in need of healing? Worship messages that begin our new year will center on *this need*. This focus will go well beyond treatment for a medical diagnosis, prescriptions, therapy, exercise, and diet to include not only addressing the physical correction but also the emotional, relational, financial, mental, and spiritual restoration we desire.

Our need for healing comes in response to the sin, brokenness, corruption, and poor choices of humans as we live in a fallen world. Not much has changed with the human condition's, lack of health and wholeness since the Bible days of old. The ancient peoples' overall health issues are still many of our issues, and our struggles with wellness were many of their struggles. The desire for healing has been and will always be large. So thanks be to God that with the coming of the Christ child, God has provided an avenue of hope. Yes, our need for healing is met with our need for the Great Physician!



The 2019 sermon series will lead us along a path of scriptural stories in which people yearned to be made well. There are three Greek Bible words that are connected with "healing." *Therapeuo* is the one with which we are probably most familiar. You can hear in this word the word *therapy*. *Therapeuo* deals with the treatment of our ailments, defects, and diseases. Jesus has the power to heal the sick and has done so on many occasions as He healed the blind, lame, deaf, and dumb. At times he used elements for this healing—physical items such as spit, mud, his hands, fingers, and even his garment that a sick woman simply touched. He later brought *therapeuo* to others through people like Peter and Paul. And today He still uses physical agents as He works through doctors, nurses, counselors, modern medicine, corrective

surgery, restorative intervention, physical therapy, etc. to bring God's amazing grace of healing into the hearts, minds, muscles, tissues and cells of those who need healing.

Iasis is another type of healing in which Jesus brought a more immediate healing upon the one in need. These healings were accomplished more by the authority of His word, voice, and command! Some of them even happened at a great distance when Jesus was nowhere even close to the ill individual. This healing is often paired with casting out demons and overcoming the forces of darkness. And though *therapeuo* healing is certainly a miracle, *iasis* healing comes across as an even stronger miracle that happens at the command of God. Today *iasis* may come when a doctor says, "We can't explain exactly what happened, but the tumor that we saw earlier is completely gone!" This type of healing, though seemingly more rare, is what we believers associate with God's ability to intervene and bring instantaneous healing upon one's body, soul, or mind.

The third type of healing is *sozo* which is the healing of the entire person-- spirit, mind, soul, and body. And though *sozo* can include physical healing, a more pure translation is "rescued" or "saved" as on more than a few occasions Jesus tells the person who is physically healed from an infirmity, "Go in peace, your faith has made you well;" or "Your faith has saved you." There are implications far beyond a bodily healing whereby God has spiritual and eternal healing in store.

So ready yourself for nine weeks into the new year of setting your sights on these three types of healing in which the Christ seeks to bless us with the abundant life which God intends for us to celebrate as we venture into 2019. And may all your needs for healing be remedied by your need for the Great Physician!

LIFE CARE MINISTRY

It has been an exciting year for Lifecare Ministry. We hit the ground running and have witnessed many lives changed. I wanted to take this time to thank the HGLC family for their welcome to me and their vision to offer ministry to this community.

I also wanted to provide an overview of the program. We have provided 149 counseling hours--roughly two-thirds of these hours were provided to the community. The stories of touched lives continue to assure me that we have joined in responding to a great need here.

Lifecare has also provided twelve weeks of training on family life. Topics have included parenting, blended families, and the shifting roles in families as aging changes responsibilities. We have also provided gentle and gracious care to parents who have lost children, to families who have experienced suicide, and to families who suffer and need the comfort of Christian acceptance.


SOAP DRIVE – Total bars of soap collected were 405. The Kinderstern children participated with this drive. Thanks to all.

December 2nd
Bi-Annual Congregational Meeting

1. Eighty-one persons attended the meeting which was called to order by Deann Reyes.
2. The 2019 Mission and Ministry Budget Plan for \$865,187 was presented and approved.
3. A Council recommendation to designate half of the mid-week Lenten offering to Houston Oromo Church was offered. After a video about the Oromo ministry was shared, a vote was made to engage in this faith giving challenge.
4. A Building Team Report was given by David Bullion indicating that the “planning phase” of the master plan was complete and it was now time for the “design phase” to begin. The initial phase was at a cost of \$5K; the next phase which would include models and resolution for spaces to hold specific ministries would cost \$50K. After some questions and discussion, it was voted to engage architect Randy Stehling for up to \$50K for this next step in the process.
5. The Endowment Charter Revision was presented by Lester Frantzen explaining that the 2013 original documents have served well, but some of the language needs to be updated. The proposal was approved and will need to be ratified at the February annual meeting.
6. Council Election: Nominating Committee report was given by Deann Reyes on behalf of the team which included Tricia Herrera, Coy Akin, Mark Moellering, Ginger Burow, Amy Montgomery, and Deann Reyes. 2019-2021 candidates Rhonda Gross, Karrie Klier, Ron Rickerhauser, and Yvonne Fox were presented and voted in by acclamation after no names were submitted from the floor.
7. It was announced that Council person Carrie Culpepper and family are moving to Lubbock, and the Council had appointed Amy Montgomery to fulfill the one-year, unexpired term of Carrie Culpepper. The congregation ratified the appointment.
8. Appreciation for Off-Going Council: Kathy Boos offered thank yous to Deann Reyes, Tricia Herrera, Coy Akin, Mark Moellering, and Carrie Culpepper for their years of service on Council.
9. The next bi-annual meeting will be Sunday, February 17, 2019.

Barnabas Ministry

We currently have 72 members of the church who are either in nursing care facilities or are home-bound members. This age group numbers larger than half of the churches in the United States in their average Sunday attendance. We currently have two visitation pastors, Pastor Jan Unger and Pastor Alan Williams, who serve this congregation of people within our congregation. While a pastoral visit and monthly communion are certainly important ministries to these folks, we are blessed to have another group of dedicated individuals who make at least a monthly visit to several of these same members.

In Matthew 9:37 Jesus said, “*The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.*” We are calling on the congregation to expand this ministry with the goal that every one of our folks in nursing care facilities or who are home-bound can receive a visit from you—from the congregation. This is not hard work. It does require a small amount of time, a caring heart, a listening ear, and a willingness to share prayer, scripture, or a devotion with one of these lovely members. Beginning in the New Year, Yvonne Fox will coordinate this ministry, taking the place of Joann Durst who has done a tremendous job these last few years. Please check with Yvonne or Pastor David if you are interested in sharing some of your God-given time with someone in need!

January Sermon Series: The New Year sermon series is titled *“Healing in the New Year”* as nine sermons will delve into various areas of human need!

Sat. & Sun., Jan. 5 & 6: The healing series kicks off with the story from John 5:1-9 in which Jesus asks the lame man, *“Do you want to be made well?”* What kind of question is that!? Don’t we all want to be healed from our problems, worries, fears, issues, and illnesses? One might assume so, but there are times when possibly we don’t truly want to be healed from something. The new year begins with a bold question, asking for a bold and faithful answer.

Sat. & Sun., Jan. 12 & 13: Who of us doesn’t need some relief from guilt? Guilt, as it has been said, *“is the gift that keeps on giving!”* As Hebrews 13:8 says, *“Jesus Christ is the same today, yesterday, and forever,”* meaning He is God of past, present, and future and certainly does not desire for anything from our past to take away anything from our present or future! Holy Communion will be served and invitations for guilt to be given over to God offered!

Sat. & Sun., Jan. 19 & 20: Healing from our fears is the focus for the weekend. The Bible often reminds us to *“fear not,”* yet this is something that is not always humanly possible as the storms of fear brew within us. Therefore, we need Jesus the Great Healer of our every ill—even over our fears.

Sat. & Sun., Jan. 26 & 27: One of the most precious gifts that God has given us for healing is the gift of FORGIVENESS. The story of Joseph (Genesis 37—45) is a powerful story of forgiveness and how God works through this gift to bring healing and hope to the world.



3. Election of 2019 officers was conducted with Kathy Boos being elected president; Greg Henricksen- VP; Steve Olfers- treasurer; and Karen Nevins- secretary.
4. Off-going council persons were appreciated: Coy Akin, Mark Moellering, Tricia Herrera, and Deann Reyes for their three years of service.
5. Lester Behrends' membership was transferred to Community Church, San Angelo.
6. The final updated and approved copy of the Youth Protection Awareness Program was handed out.
7. Changing insurance premiums were discussed.
8. Two anonymous gifts were celebrated (see elsewhere in this newsletter).
9. New Investment Team members were approved: David Bullion (2nd term), Jim Roeder (1st term), and Brenda Beaty (Stewardship rep).
10. "Other Benevolence" budget line items were voted to be disbursed to: The Grace Center (domestic violence house)- \$4,000; Special Olympics- \$1,500; and MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers)- \$541.
11. Council resource books and anticipated content for the upcoming retreat on January 25-26 at Camp Ebert were discussed.
12. The meeting ended at 8:10pm with the group praying for the joys and concerns of the community.

Holy Ghost Church was the recipient of a Community Foundation of the Texas Hill Country gift of \$25K from the Laura Pfiester Schmidt Fund. Laura Schmidt was a past member of HGLC. The donation is designated to support the Lifecare Ministry (\$15K) and Mexico Missions (\$10K). Praise be to God for the vision and faith of the faithful hearts behind this gift!

In addition, a \$20K gift was received, with half designated for the Future Associate Pastor Fund (to hopefully be a reality sometime in 2020) and half for the High Tech Fund which supports ever-changing technology so that the church might effectively minister in relevant ways in 2019.

"*Celebration of Discipline*" is the title of the book by Richard Foster that Pastor Bobby will lead beginning February 10. Content covers twelve spiritual disciplines which Christians can practice to strengthen their relationship with God. Special Offering for January: Needy Persons Fund

There is a surprising number of people in our community who struggle to provide food for their family, pay utility bills, make medical payments, etc. HGCLC has two funds which provide support for those who make their needs known to the pastors. One is the Alex Frantzen Trust Fund which extends a helping hand to HGCLC members Specifically, and the other is the Emergency Aid Fund which can provide assistance to HGCLC members as well as anyone from the community. When a need is made known to the pastors, a confidential process is followed: a personal visit is made, research is done, stories are checked out, and the situation is thoroughly vetted before any assistance is rendered. After the pastors consult with one another, funds are distributed directly to the organization where the bill is due. Use the brown pew envelope to contribute to these funds. Half will be placed into the Frantzen Fund and half to the Emergency Aid Fund. Jesus' words from Matthew 25 apply: *"I was hungry, and you fed me, naked and you clothed me, thirsty and you gave me drink."*
