## The Story in Stained Glass

*Holy Ghost Lutheran Church is very blessed to have an art collection of stained glass windows! Thirty-nine decorative glass windows adorn our sanctuary. Installed at various times during the history of the church, the oldest known date for the placement of stained glass windows is 1919-20 with others being added in '26, 38, and '49. The 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary edition of the church history records, “Additional stained glass windows were added in 1919 to the original church sanctuary,” so it is possible that some of the original church stained glass are not dated or are “colored glass” as in the windows in the bell tower. Further research of the hand-written German script in the church records can hopefully reveal when the actual first ones made their home in this sacred collection.*

*This summer’s sermon series is in fact “The Story in Stained Glass” and will focus on the messages and symbolism embodied in this historic collection. Time will not warrant a sermon on each of the thirty-nine windows, so some will be combined with others as fourteen weekends spotlight the majority of them. A special colored booklet will whet the appetite as well as serve as a memorable keepsake.*

*The story in stained glass that surrounds us weekly is a rich and deep heritage of our faith rooted in the Bible and the theology of the Lutheran Church. We anticipate a wonderful journey which will begin the first weekend in June and end on Labor Day weekend. So as you sit, listen, view, ponder, and meditate on each of these artistic faith treasures, may the good news of God in Jesus sent by the power of the Holy Spirit strengthen and empower you personally and us as a congregation as we seek to “Be and Make Disciples!”*

**LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF GATHERING** – April 23, 2019 was such an exciting day when 17 volunteers helped load the truck with Lutheran World Relief items to be delivered to Seguin. Fifteen area Lutheran churches brought their items to be transported. Holy Ghost members sent 487 quilts, 172 Personal Care Kits, 47 Baby Care Kits, 11 School Kits, 60 pounds of soap and \$2,974.00 for shipping. Overall totals included 1,610 quilts, 289 School Kits, 34 Fabric Kits, 110 Baby Care Kits, 486 Personal Care Kits, 248 pounds of soap, and \$4,252.90 for shipping. We have an outstanding and giving congregation, and we are forever grateful for your participation. Thanks to the ladies who provided cookies for refreshments. The Women of Faith provided lunch.

**Organ Restoration**

The historic organ that is the worship instrument for one-third of our services is in need of repair and upgrade. The 1970's were the last time it received in-depth Attention, and believe it or not, the area of work done at that time is still in good condition! The part of the organ that presently needs work is the section that was last worked on in the 1930's, so it's about time! Overhauling the organ so it can serve the church for the next ninety years will cost about \$250K. With a generous gift from the estate of Dottie Lucas for \$200K and additional gifts adding up to another \$25K, the cost of this project is nearly paid. Special gifts are currently being received so that the total goal might be achieved. HGLC is on the work list for mid to late 2020 for this restoration to take place. The FBG Food Pantry experiences heightened need in the summer primarily due to the school district's being out of session and no longer providing breakfast and lunch for children who financially qualify to receive these meals. Oromo Weekend

We have a unique opportunity to be at the heart of the mission of sharing God’s Word. The mission church, The Oromo Evangelical Lutheran Church of Houston, is served by Pastor Kamiso Boro. They are currently renting space from First Evangelical Lutheran Church in Houston, several miles from their prime location. The goal is to raise \$900,000 to help them find a location in the heart of the African immigrant community in Houston to make inroads into an area with 4,000+ unchurched people. This is an effort by the Texas Mission Region to help this church establish a location in which to expand their ministry and grow their congregation.

In the North American Lutheran Church, mission outreach comes from the local congregations supporting missions in their local areas or regions. Money is not funneled down from the national church body. Rather support is from the ground up as local congregations gather to offer their financial support as well as prayer as we build relationships with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

The potential for the growth of this mission church is tremendous. Pastor Kamiso has a proven track record in Ethiopia and has been called to serve in Houston to duplicate those efforts. Pastor Paul Austin has been working with our Texas Mission Region on a campaign to make this dream a reality. Pastor Austin will be with us on June 1 & 2 to share a temple talk at each worship service and to be available during our Sunday School hour at 9:15 a.m. to share more about this mission effort and answer any questions that you might have.

On June 9, Pentecost Sunday, the children’s choir from the Oromo Evangelical Church of Houston will join us for the 10:30 a.m. service to share music with us and bring their joy and inspiration to Holy Ghost. We are asking people to prayerfully consider a special gift to help support this mission effort in Houston. Large gifts, small gifts, and any donations in between are welcome. We will continue to give opportunity for folks to contribute through special offerings through the months of June and July. As Jesus reminded us at the end of Matthew’s Gospel, we are called to “Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”

**JUNE WORSHIP THEMES**

**Summer Sermon Series:** “The Story in Stained Glass” will feature various windows in the church and reveal the story and symbolism of each.

**Sat. & Sun., June 1 & 2:** We start the summer sermon series, “The Story in Stained Glass,” as we look at our rich history and the artwork of our church tied into our faith and important stories from the Bible. This first week we look at the three windows in the west transept which share the common theme of the Incarnation – God coming into the world by sending His only begotten Son, Jesus. These stories are shared at the beginning of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

**Sat. & Sun., June 8 & 9:** Our story in stained glass continues with baptism. As this weekend is the celebration of Pentecost, the birth of the church, it is very appropriate to focus on the gift of the Holy Spirit that comes to us in baptism; and Baptism is our entry into the church and the foundation upon which our faith is founded.

**Sat. & Sun., June 15 & 16:** “The Cross on the Rock in the Sea” is the stained glass window of the week. The Bible often speaks of troubles as storms and God as being our Rock. Of course, at the center of it all is the cross of Christ to which we cling!

**Sat. & Sun., June 22 & 23:** “Jesus Standing at the Door Knocking” is the window which is inspired by Revelation 3:20. Jesus will never force entry upon us but does invite us to respond to His gentle bidding. Holy Communion is offered for those who desire it.

**Sat. & Sun., June 29 & 30:** “The Alpha and Omega” window depicts the Greek letters for A and Z! Christ is the beginning and the end and is with us in everything in between. This stained glass is rooted in Revelation 1:8.

**Council Report  
May 20, 2019**

1. Vice-president Greg Henricksen called the meeting to order. Pastor David offered the opening devotion and prayer.
2. Cindy Heifner, the executive director at the Needs Council, offered a presentation about the possible use of HGLC space for a parent/child visitation program. Council will research further, pray and ponder it.
3. An anonymous gift of \$25K was directed in the following ways: \$2700 to the Oromo Mission Church in Houston, \$10,300 for a new office copy machine, and \$12,000 for the Life Care Ministry Program.
4. Another anonymous gift of \$25K was Apportioned: \$20K for the Youth Fund and \$5K for the High Tech Fund.
5. The "Going Deep and Wide" book conversation centered around worship music styles and the question "Are we offering enough worship music diversity?"
6. Representatives from the organ company will be on site in June to give a better description of the work needed to have the organ restored. The approximate bid is \$250K. \$225K has been received thus far.
7. The meeting ended at 8:35pm with the group's praying for the joys and concerns of the church and community.
