A Passion for Education

In Proverbs 1:7 we hear these words, “*The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge.*” That phrase is repeated throughout the book of Proverbs. Proverbs are wisdom literature which give us instructions about life so that we may make informed decisions and good choices. They also warn us of the dangers of foolish decisions or actions. Much of this instruction was written by King Solomon, to whom God gave much wisdom.

As you read this article our schools will be in the process of gearing up for another year. Teachers will be preparing for students, and praying for willing learners and patience to deal with those who might be a challenge. And many students are hanging on to the last vestiges of freedom before they return to familiar patterns; others eagerly await to be filled with knowledge. Parents look forward to that routine of school and a sense of normalcy once again. Education is important. It is the way that we discover more about this amazing world God has made. My prayer is that each student would find his or her particular niche, that subject which ignites passion and brings inspiration and creativity to our world while not neglecting those supporting subjects that round out one’s education.

It is from that passion for education that I write to you today, particularly a passion for Christian education. My father, Luther Priem, had a passion for Christian education. He served for twenty-seven years as Sunday School superintendent at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Pflugerville, Texas. Yes! My dad had a real job as well. He was a businessman. He worked in finances most of his life, beginning as a bank teller at a small bank in Round Rock and ending his career as the director of the State of Texas Health Department Credit Union in Austin. He did that job well and had a knack for it. He also helped his father with the family farm and many of the chores that went with that.

But my dad’s real passion was Christian education. I watched him prepare for those long meetings at church to help plan curriculum, secure volunteers to teach, administer the records and finances, keep track of attendances, hand out awards, and prepare the annual Christmas program. Each Saturday afternoon and evening, after chores were done, he would spend a good bit of time preparing for the Sunday School opening, which in that day and time was essentially a mini-worship service. He would pick a Bible theme and a couple of songs to go along with it, lead a short liturgy, recognize birthdays and celebrations, welcome new students, and release children and teachers to their classrooms while he roamed around peeking into the classrooms or taking care of other business.

I still remember Sunday mornings. At that time, we had two worship services. The early service was at 7:45 am. Our day started much earlier. We had to get up, get dressed, eat breakfast, and get to town so that dad could open up the Education Building, get all the materials out in the teachers’ classrooms, set up chairs and tables, and make sure the lights and air or heat were on. We all tagged along, and as we got older we pitched in and helped with all of that. Never once did any of us feel like we were forced to go. It was something that we did as a family. It was our service and duty to God and the church. It was a part of who we were!

I tell that story because it had an impact on my future to become a pastor. It wasn’t the only influence, but it had a major impact. I guess a lot of my dad rubbed off on me. I believe in the value of Christian education, and I love to teach, especially the Bible. It is a passion of mine. I believe we live in a day and time when people have taken their Christian education for granted. Life-long learning about God is important. I want to encourage you, as we get into that season of school, to make the effort to get involved in a Bible class, a weekday Bible study, or a small group; get your children and grandchildren involved in Sunday School and your high school youth on Sundays or Wednesday Youth Worship & Praise which Pastor Clint leads. There is so much we have yet to learn about God and from God that I don’t want any person to miss out. The more that we are in God’s Word, studying, reading, and praying, the bigger positive influence we can have on our world. May God give each of you a passion for wanting to get to know Him on a deeper level and growth in your faith!

Two Church Assemblies Upcoming!

As you read this, Kathy Boos, Karrie Klier, Pastor Clint, Pastor Jan, and Pastor David are attending the annual North American Lutheran Church Convocation Aug 8-9. While it is our annual meeting to take care of the business of the church there is so much more that takes place at a convocation. It includes a youth convocation to strengthen and inspire youth workers in their task. Also within the convocation is a National Women of Faith meeting where they conduct business and are inspired by different speakers and workshops. There is a Theological Conference connected to it for pastors and any leaders to receive inspiration and further training for ministry. A mission focus is included as well, to hear about and support the various missionaries and mission churches we support around the globe. Always there are several ministry booths with passionate volunteers ready to engage folks in particular ministry interests around the world.

This year we will elect a new bishop. Bishop John Bradosky has served well for the two terms that he has been in office. There is a two-term limit for the office of bishop. The nomination process for a new bishop has lifted up the names of twelve very qualified pastors, all with different gifts to bring to the table. We ask for your prayers as we come together in Indianapolis for this important election. Pray that God would guide the election, and that the person chosen would be chosen with the gifts and passion to carry out the vision and mission of the NALC as we work together. HGLC is rostered with both the NALC & the LCMC! About 350 persons from all across Texas will meet for worship, fellowship, leadership, educational enhancements, food and fun! Pray that the time invested will build relationships to continue working together for the strengthening of the LCMC in Texas!

Barnabas Ministry

In Acts 6, the early church was growing, and with its growth came growing pains. One of those was the ministry to care for people in need, particularly widows and orphans. What was their solution? They first prayed about it. God's answer was to choose seven people full of the Spirit and Wisdom. Stephen is the most famous of those; he was later martyred for his faith in God which would plant seeds in the heart of a young man named Saul, whose life would be turned around drastically; with it came a change in name to Paul, the greatest witness to the faith the world has ever known.

The ministry of these chosen seven may have begun as a ministry to care for those in need, but it was much more than just a social ministry. Along with feeding and caring for their needs, they brought spiritual nourishment by sharing God's Word, sharing fellowship with them, and praying for them in the midst of their struggles.

We have a thriving ministry to those in need in our church family and community, particularly to those who are homebound or in nursing care facilities. We are always looking for more men, women, couples, or even families to care. It does include a commitment of time at least once a month or more to make a visit to one of these folks in need. It includes spending a little time with them, getting to know them, building that relationship, and while doing so, offering them prayer and sharing the Bible with them. The question has been asked often, “Why is there a Jewish Star of David on a Christian Church?” For now I will simply give you a small bite of information—it has to do with our Judeo-Christian heritage. To learn more, come and bring a friend to any of the services this weekend!

Sat. & Sun., August 10 & 11: The window of the week is Mary, Martha, and Jesus as the Lord celebrates Mary’s faith and cautions Martha’s. What is the balance between sitting at Jesus feet and serving? What is the relationship between the two? Holy Communion will be served!

Sat. & Sun., August 17 & 18: The stained glass series will lean into the three windows in the east transept as the theme covers the trilogy of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Jesus’ glorious ascension into heaven to be seated at the right hand of the Father. Sacrifice, death, and victory go hand in hand in God’s love story for sinners.

Sat. & Sun., August 24 & 25: This week’s window features the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. The Lamb is our substitute on the cross who would rise triumphant defeating sin, death, and Satan! Holy Communion is offered to all who come with penitent hearts!

Sat. & Sun., August 30 & Sep. 1: The Story in Stained Glass sermon series concludes this weekend with the windows at the entrance of the church. Holy Ghost Church is called “Evangelical”—what does that mean as we come and go? The descending dove window inspires us as we enter and then sends us on our way to “Be and Make Disciples!”

**Council Report
July 15, 2019**

1. President Kathy Boos called the meeting to order and Pastor David led the opening devotion and prayer.
2. Rhonda Gross presented an update on the court-ordered visitation program that HGLC may partner with the county and Needs Council to provide space for such visits as there is no program or space currently provided in Gillespie County.
3. An anonymous gift of \$8K was received with designations for half of it to be applied to the organ restoration fund and the other half for a small group initiative.
4. An anonymous gift of \$40,555 was received without designation. The council will weigh and pray about how it might best be utilized for the kingdom.
5. "Live streaming" weekend worship subjects will be researched by a small team that will be assembled to get the Word of God in more homes, screens, and devices.
6. A new church office copy machine is being looked into as the current model has over 1.6 million copies and is beginning to limp.
7. A new church software program is being investigated whereby records and finances might be more streamlined and efficient.
8. The church council is exploring the possibility of having an outside audit of the church finance books done for the purpose of good order.
9. The meeting ended in praying for the joys and needs of many.

Organ Restoration in the Making!

Our historic church organ has served the church well over the many years it has played the hymns we sing. In recent years, it has created some sounds that were not intentional, and the band aid approach has about come to an end. A needed overhaul of the instrument will cost \$250K, and the church is already on the 2021 waiting list for this unique type service. With the tremendous gift of nearly \$200K from the Fred & Dottie Lucas estate, as well as several other generous donations, the Organ Restoration Fund currently has \$230K.
