Being & Making Disciples!

Is There Going to Be Church?

Just a few short weeks ago we had to answer the question, “*Is here going to be church?*” And depending on what one might mean by the inquiry, the answer could be “No” if it meant gathering under the same roof. But, in truth the answer is simply and profoundly—YES because we’re going to be the Church whether or not we’re physically meeting at 115 E. San Antonio Street!

The Church will never cease to be the Church because the Church is not dependent on believers meeting at a central place we think of as a church building. We have grown accustomed to assembling at a common location ever since the Christian Church was deemed one of the legal religions of the Roman Empire by Emperor Constantine in 325 A.D. and buildings began to be built.

We can, however, really trace our Judeo-Christian religious building roots back to the Jerusalem Jewish temple built by King Solomon in about 950 B.C. Prior to that, the “house of God” was the tabernacle, basically a large tent that travelled around with the Jews from place to place until the temple was finally erected.

Remnants of some of the oldest Christian churches still standing today can trace sections of their structures back to the mid-fourth century. These are scattered throughout Egypt, Africa, Asia, and southern Europe. And so for a very long time “the Church” body has been meeting in dedicated places which grow to be very important to our communities.

History tells us just how meaningful these spaces are, especially when we reflect upon the Jews who were defeated by the Babylonians in 586 B.C. when the first temple was destroyed. This action nearly broke the back of God’s people as they believed that their true identity was tied to a building which then lay in ruins.

The Holy Ghost Church family and friends may have some similar feelings in not having worship access to the sacred space that we have come to know as God’s house for us. It is the place where believers have gathered since 1893 when our beautiful building was dedicated, and from that time we simply have opened the doors on a Saturday, Sunday, or Wednesday and people flock to the pews to hear the Word proclaimed, sing praises, pray, receive Holy Communion, gaze at the stained glass, offer gifts of thanksgiving, and then exit to re-enter the world for service in Christ’s name! It seems eerily strange for the time being that the doors are closed, organ is silent, and pews sit vacant.

Yet as wonderful a feeling as it is being in the church building with sisters and brothers of the faith, of all the ministry that Jesus did on earth, He never built a building! For when Christ established His Church it was founded on the faith of the people who called Him Lord and Savior! They convened around Him to be fed and were then sent out to be the Church to those around them!

Yes, the Church is not the building, the Church is not the steeple, but the Church is God’s faithful people! And God’s Church cannot be destroyed by Babylonians or WW2 bombs; neither can it be stopped by a virus. For the Church is you and me as we go about our daily lives scattering seeds of hope, goodness, light, grace, forgiveness, mercy, service, and peace into those who need it most!

So while we wait for the building doors to re-open and we pray that day be sooner as opposed to later, the Church will not cease to be the Church! We will need to think more creatively and it will look a bit different—but the Church will continue to be the Church!

We will gather “virtually” where we can be together, connected in the Spirit through technology, on Sunday mornings at 10:30am on the Holy Ghost Lutheran Church Facebook page (and posted for later viewing also), as well as at 10am on Sundays on KNAF radio 910AM at 10 o’clock am. Your home computers, cell phones, and radios are the venues where for the time being we gather to “be together” for worship, but then we are called to find new & varied ways to reach out to one another and our community with our phones, face-time, texting, tweeting, letter writing, and even running errands for others—seeking to be the faithful Church spreading light, leaven, and salt that God calls us to share.

So back to the question, “*Is there going to be church?*” As long as we continue to be fed on God’s Word and then look for opportunities to point others to Jesus, we will never cease to be Church! Holy Ghosters, as we wait for the church doors to open again—be what you are inherently called to be—The Church! Amen?

Small Groups During Social Distancing

As you have probably heard, Holy Ghost has recently started Small Group Ministry with the mission of **Strengthening the Saved by Growing Friendships and Faith.** The concept is simple...get together with some people, have some fun, and do something...a devotion, a Bible study, a prayer... that grows your relationship with God. But how do we do this during this time of social distancing? Here are some ideas:

Gather with some friends at the park. You can easily stay 6 feet from each other. Everyone brings his own snack and drink. Take a walk, or just sit in your personal lawn chair and visit. What a great time to bring along a devotion you found online and share it with your friends. Maybe you even pray together! The upside to our current situation is that it is happening in the spring, a wonderful time to be outside in the Hill Country!

Get on the phone! Daily chatting on the phone is a lost art! Some of you remember the days when the gold phone, with rotary dial and 10-foot-long cord, hung on the kitchen wall and rang constantly – not from telemarketers but from friends and neighbors catching up for the day. Now that many of us have more time at home on our hands, pick up the phone. Check in with the couple that sits in the next pew, the widow down the street, or even an old friend.

We're all craving conversation and interaction, especially during this time of lessened organized activities. Consider sharing a Bible verse that has comforted you lately. If a call isn't comfortable, text or email!

Learn some new technology. There are hundreds of apps you can download on your phone for free that will make connecting easier. I recently heard about an app called Marco Polo. This app is described as a cross between a walkie-talkie and a video chat. Basically, you record a message to a friend or a group of friends, and then they can either watch live or watch later at their convenience. From there, the friend(s) can respond, either by video or by text, and a conversation happens. This is a great way for a group to meet without any germs involved! And devotions and prayer can easily be incorporated!

Our current small groups and the forming of new ones will resume when it's safe for us to be together in a physical way. Until then, take this time to find other ways to strengthen yourself and others by growing friendships and faith!

APRIL WORSHIP THEMES

April Sermon Series: “I am” is the message series for April as these Biblical statements are explored and applied to Christian living.

Wed., Apr. 1: Jesus proclaims, “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life.” Access to salvation is only possible through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ not through our works and not through any other religion. All roads do not lead to the Eternal Father. Jesus said, *“I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father but by Me.”*

Sat. & Sun., Apr. 4 & 5: Jesus’ triumphant ride into Jerusalem is only part of the story and only part of the way, but the way leads to another road. Jesus’ truth about us is not His only truth for us. And Jesus’ life for us is the beginning of the new & eternal life He has in store for us.

Maundy Thur., Apr. 9: Maundy Thursday worship will focus upon the “I AM” statement by Jesus in John 6:35 where He says, *“I Am the Bread of Life.”* While we think about our physical needs to eat, curb our hunger, and nourish our bodies, Jesus points us to the ‘daily bread’ which includes everything we need for this daily life-physical, spiritual, and emotional. May we look for daily nourishment from God by being in His Word and in prayer.

Good Friday., Apr. 10: Jesus says, “I am the Door” as we hear about the cross being the key that unlocks the door for forgiveness, and thus righteousness with God. We hear the Passion story of Christ’s death.

Sat. & Sun., Apr. 20 & 21: It’s Resurrection Day as we proclaim: *“Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!”* Sunrise service is at 7am outside the Fellowship Hall! Festive Easter worships are set for 8am & 10:30am! Don’t miss the day of days in the Christian Church as the theme celebrates Jesus’ proclaiming, “I am the Resurrection and the Life!”

Sat. & Sun., Apr. 18 & 19: On this first weekend of Easter, when the disciples were still in hiding following Jesus’ resurrection Jesus appears to them in the midst of their fears and worries and proclaims, “Peace be with you!” In these difficult times, it is that peace of God we need to calm and strengthen us in our faith.

Sat. & Sun., Apr. 25 & 26: The familiar story for today comes from Luke 24, The Road to Emmaus. It is a great reminder that Jesus walks alongside us in our journey. There may be times that we either take that for granted, or we are focused or distracted by other things. We have the reassurance that Jesus is with us always, even until the end of time.


