***“I was glad when they said, ‘Let us go unto the house of the Lord!’” Psalm 122:1***

As your church council and pastoral leadership team have pondered and prayed over “in person” worship, we have not just been asking ourselves “when” do we start again, but “how” do we start? For the “how” is possibly even more important than the “when.”

No one is more eager to be together in worship as the Holy Ghost Church family than your leaders, yet there is more to the equation than simply opening the doors and conducting services as we formerly did pre-COVID-19. There is now a whole set of guidelines for group meetings and some additional ones we have set forth for an extra layer of precautionary measures in our church.

It’s important to note that churches and church programs are not designed for social distancing. We are accustomed to relational fellowship, proximity, shaking hands, hugging, close contact, sharing the peace, handing out bread and wine and sitting side by side. It will certainly be a joy to return to the Lord’s House, yet as we move into the worship setting, our experience will not *initially* look or feel exactly like we previously knew it.

The plan is that if the number of coronavirus cases do not increase heavily over the next few weeks, HGLC will begin “in person” worship, hopefully in the near up-coming future with a “soft” opening. “Soft” means a gradual coming back to our normal understanding of worship. We pray that the time for a more “old normal” form of worship will return, but while we wait for that time and journey into the “new normal,” we must temporarily re-structure some components and adapt a few practices for an interim. It’s a matter of us learning how to gather safely and responsibly in our unique architectural setting given the risks and restraints that the coronavirus has brought into our lives.

Of highest priority is to honor God by what we do and don’t do, loving and caring for our neighbor. So at the very top of the list is the health protection of those most vulnerable as well as exercising measures above and beyond standard state guidelines to help prevent an infestation in the workplace and further cause an even greater negative economic impact in our community.

As a church have a spiritual responsibility to the Holy Ghost family of faith, and we have a social responsibility to the town we serve. And though we will crawl before we walk and walk before we run again, anticipate that *how* we begin will not be *how* we will continue along the way.

So expect things to look a bit different for a while. Consider it a beginning, not an ending, and with continued positive statewide health, additional familiar pieces will be added to the worship as we journey forward.

Some safeguards for best practice guidelines as well as things that you might anticipate as we begin meeting again for worship are included on page two of the newsletter. Please read them thoroughly and we sincerely ask that you follow them as we attempt to re-engage worship safely and responsibly. Be aware and respectful of differing ideas of social interaction. These precautions are not offered in fear, but in love for the well being and comfort levels of others.

Thank you for your prayers, patience and indulgence with your leaders as we fumble through these unknowns, seeking to faithfully lead as God will guide.

### **Safeguards for Best Practice Guidelines When Returning to Worship**

- 1- Those who are 65 or older or at risk persons are encouraged to watch or participate in the service remotely which will continue to be offered (radio, Facebook, Youtube).
- 2- Two worship times on Sunday, 8:00am & 10:30am (Saturday will be added at a later date).
- 3- Worshiping in the Fellowship Hall for the first few weeks so that persons can be more spread out, ingress & egress are easier, and restroom availability is more accessible.
- 4- Marks on the sidewalk to assist in social distancing.
- 5- The availability of hand sanitizer as you enter.
- 6- Masks/coverings are strongly encouraged. Some will be available upon request, but bringing your own saves the church the expense!
- 7- Temperatures will be scanned upon entrance, and all are encouraged to observe signs posted for possible symptoms of COVID-19. Should you have fever or any signs or symptoms, are asked to not attend services.
- 8- An usher will seat persons from the front of the church to rear. Ushers will assist persons in exiting the church from the rear to the front. Family units may sit together.
- 9- Please refrain from hand shaking or hugs.
- 10- One person in the restroom at a time; please know and check before entering a bathroom.
- 11- Initially hymns will be led by a song leader with all invited to sing softly, hum, or meditate on the words.
- 12- A secure offering box will be located at each entrance/exit.
- 13- Prayer card requests may be placed in the offering box or texted to the prayer line at 830-383-0249.
- 14- Use sanitizer on the way out of church and wash hands thoroughly when arriving home.
- 15- All surfaces will be cleaned & disinfected between worship services.
- 16- For the time being Holy Communion, Sunday School, nursery childcare, monthly disciples, acolytes, registration pads, and coffee fellowship will be suspended. Programs and monthly meetings may meet socially distanced outdoors.

Government Stimulus Checks

Many in our church may be receive a check from Uncle Sam in the amounts of \$1,200 per adult and \$500 per child for qualifying families based on income. Some are desperately in need of this financial assistance and may even need more! Others however, due to being more financially blessed, may not really need the supplement to make it through the coronavirus crisis. If you find yourself in the latter category and have resources available to you but still receive a stimulus check, you might consider donating it to an organization like the Needs Council that is ministering to hundreds of people who are without jobs and in great need of funds for rent, food, and health care. HGLC also has an "Emergency Fund" that the pastors oversee for situations of need for members and persons in our community. Both the church and Needs Council vet persons who request assistance, and both provide tax deductions for donations.

*“Come, let us worship the Lord!”*

### JUNE WORSHIP THEMES

**Sermon Series:** : “Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” is the title for the summer season. It is based on that specific petition in the Lord’s Prayer in which Martin Luther goes into great detail to explain what is meant by “daily bread.” Luther writes, “daily bread includes: food, clothing, home and property, work and income, family, a good community, government, fair weather, peace, health, a good name, friends and neighbors.” With the Coronavirus, this sounds like a fine way to think about the basics of life through the summer!

**Sun., June 7:** “Daily Bread” is the title of the introduction message for the summer sermon series. Martin Luther gives a good start to what he believes Jesus meant by it as we explore this petition of the Lord’s Prayer.

**Sun., June 14:** Our Summer Sermon Series on “Daily Bread – The Basics of Life” focuses today on food. We take so much for granted, and if we have learned anything from this pandemic, it is to treasure the resources we have and give thanks to the one who has provided all we have in the first place. Basic to life is food. We need to eat to live. First we need to thank God, and second, we need to thank farmers!

**Sun., June 21:** This is Father’s Day weekend, and what an appropriate time to Focus on the Family. When Luther talks about Daily Bread, one of the things he includes on that list of those things necessary for life is a “Devoted Family.” Notice he didn’t say “perfect family,” but a devoted family. How can families be that place of safety, security, encouragement, and love?

**Sun., June 28:** “A Good Name” is the title of the message that will uplift our need for and value of a good reputation. A good name goes a long way in relationships and life. We have a good name when we are called “Christian!” May we live up to our name in Him!


