Colorado Camp Plans

As much as we wish we could go to Colorado for camp as we normally do as a big church group, it is just not going to be possible this year. Having thoroughly reviewed the 80 pages of guidelines shared by the American Camp Association, we've made this decision because... #1 We have such a huge group of people with 40+ students & adults. #2 We have huge transportation issues with no housing available on the trip as we have had in the past, and now ACA guidelines also calls for everyone to both wear masks and still maintain physical distance while in vehicles. #3 While at camp, if someone were to develop symptoms, we would need to isolate and transport separately, and we would be 800 miles away from home. Therefore, as tough as it is, we believe this is the best decision for our group as a whole. However, if individual families would still like to take their students to attend camp, our church will still gladly support and provide camp scholarships and any funds raised with the church will be mailed to our families. No matter what, most importantly, we remember Romans 8:28 which declares, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to His purpose!"
