“Beat the Heat”

Genesis 18 begins like this: *“The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, ‘My Lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree.’”*

The land of Israel has a few places that are lush and green, but very few. Most of the landscape is arid, hot, dry, and desert-like. Summer temperatures easily rise into the triple digits. To some degree, the weather can feel a lot like Gillespie County, but with less rain!

The story says that Abraham was at the oaks of Mamre, sitting at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. I can see his tent pitched under the shadows of some large leaves, not inside the oven-stuffy tent. He was seated just outside the tent, catching what little bit of a hot breeze might be blowing that afternoon. The word says, it was the “heat of the day.”

It causes me to think about what other type of “heat” that Abraham and his wife Sarah were possibly experiencing at this particular time of their life. Prior to chapter 18, we read that this couple was childless and for those especially in Bible days, having children was very important if not vital to the family identity. Children were a sign of prosperity, even more so than money and possessions. And lack of children could even be interpreted as the disfavor of God.

Genesis 18

“Is Anything Too Hard
for the Lord?”



In Genesis 17, the Lord promised Abraham that Sarah would bear a son. We read how Abraham reacted to that promise. In Genesis 18 we find out how Sarah reacted when she learned of this same promise.

Abraham & Sarah were quite wealthy with silver, gold, servants, and thousands of head of livestock. They had made their fortune in life, and yet they longed for the treasure of a child. God had promised them that He was going to make a nation of people from them, and now in their elderly years, with Abraham at one hundred years and Sarah knocking on ninety, wondered how could this promise ever be? It was more than just the heat from that summer day that was beating down on them—it was the long, hot, dry season of being childless as well.

They were trying to beat the heat by laying up in the shade trees of some oaks, attempting to catch a little cross ventilation at the door of their tent, but the relief they were really seeking was one that they had been looking for their entire married life. And it was then in the heat of their personal battle that God visited them in the form of three angels who quenched their thirst by bringing the good news of a son born in their old age.

What heat are you facing these days? We can certainly look at the weather reports and air conditioning bills and sigh the multiple afternoons of a hundred plus degree days that have been achieved already and we are just now entering August! But what other hot, dry, arid season might you be going through right now?

There is no need to list examples. You know and God knows where the heat is on for you, and you need to know that God knows the horrid hot stress that you are under.

As God did for Abraham and Sarah in sending a son to bring them relief from their fiery furnace, so He has sent His only begotten Son to bring release in yours. So whatever is raising the temperature in your soul these days, causing you to sweat like an ocean on the inside-- allow the Son of God to be the One who rains His grace upon your blistering, dry land.

Abraham and Sarah ended up experiencing an oasis in their desert by being the parents of a people that numbered as many as the grains of sand on the beach and stars in the sky! And He will, no doubt, open up His heavens and shower you with His abundant grace as you trust Him.

Amen? Amen!

7. Crash bar exit for the west side church entrance will be installed.
8. The meeting ended at 9:15pm with Pastor David leading the group in praying for the joys and concerns of the church and community.

WORSHIP IN AUGUST

“Come, let us worship the Lord!”

AUGUST WORSHIP THEMES

Sermon Series: “Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” continues in August. It is based on that specific petition in the Lord’s Prayer which Martin Luther goes into great detail to explain what is meant by “daily bread.” Luther writes, “daily bread includes: food, clothing, home and property, work and income, family, a good community, government, fair weather, peace, health, a good name, friends and neighbors.

Sun., Aug. 2: The daily bread of the week is “clothing.” There is a curious story early in the Bible in Genesis 3 that speaks about a sin torn couple sewing fig leaves together to cover themselves. It’s very interesting to compare what we humans use to cover our sin with, and what God uses to cover us. Re-read Genesis 3 as the focus is on “God’s clothing for us!”

Sun., Aug. 9: “Favorable weather” is the bread of the week as we explore the four seasons which life often brings into our lives. The weather conditions can’t be changed, but how we respond to the circumstances can, knowing that even though we know the weather is always changing, one thing never does—Jesus Christ! Read Hebrews 13:8.

Sun., Aug. 16: The bread that’s served up for the weekend is “Peace.” It’s something we all desire to experience, especially when life may not be so peace-filled. Philippians 4:6-7 is so very often quoted during troubling times. In it is a four-part formula for experiencing peace, in which we often lean on three parts, but leave out one very important piece. Read the verses and discover the missing piece.

Sun., Aug. 23: “Community” is the bread that’s on the table this weekend as the theme will lean into our town as well as “schools.” The service will feature a “back-to-school” blessing as this day marks the eve of children heading back to school, or possibly doing school on-line.

Sun., Aug. 30: When we talk about “bread,” one of the connotations of the word is “dough” and “money.” “Income” is the subject for the week as stewardship of finances is studied. We don’t often like to cover the subject, but believe it or not, stewardship of our resources is mentioned more in the Bible than prayer. We’d be ignoring God’s emphasis on it, if we didn’t have at least one sermon a year on it! It’s especially a relevant topic in slimmer times as these.

August Special Offering is designated for the Ethiopian OROMO Lutheran Mission in Houston. HGLC has been supporting the establishment of this ministry for several years now, but it like many mission churches that find it hard to get started, has been hit extra hard by the COVID-19. HOLY GHOST SMALL GROUPS... LIKE THE EARLY CHURCH

Despite the distance we've been keeping, I'm pleased to share that we've added to our eight charter small groups with seven new groups that started this summer and six more that are in the early stages of coming together. Many of us are enjoying the friendship- and faith-building that happens when we gather in a more intimate setting and get to know each other and God on a more personal level.

Small groups are modeled after the description of the early church in Acts 2: in homes, sharing meals, praising God, enjoying each other, studying together, supporting each other... I recently read an article titled, **6 Crucial Small Group Lessons from the Early Church***. In this article, the author shares his research on how people did church in the early days and outlines his significant findings in six bullet points. Those points are outlined below, along with some of his quotes and how small groups at Holy Ghost are similar.

#1 They ate together. "The early church was not centered around a Bible study. A meal was crucial to their life together. People connect, talk and share life over meals."

HG: Along with a devotion, food and visiting are central at our group gatherings.

#2 They experienced repetition of contact. "This is... how social capital is built through multiple, but short, interactions with one another."

HG: Our groups meet at least monthly, allowing members to build closer relationships with each other over time.

#3 Their church experience was public. "...as they met in homes with windows that had no glass panes and were built adjacent to other homes with streets only six feet wide, a house church meeting would have been on public display."

HG: Our gatherings often (always during this COVID era) happen outside. What a great witness to neighbors and passers-by to see a group of people fellowshiping, studying, and praying together.

#4 They experienced a lot of failure. "We are talking about real people with real problems. Small groups are messy."

HG: Our groups are constantly changing to adapt to circumstances (think COVID) and group members' needs.

#5 They expected to meet with God when they gathered. "The early church depended upon the living presence of Jesus in their midst who would speak, heal and touch lives."

HG: God moments happen in our groups. After a few gatherings you come to expect them!

#6 They were team-based. "Leaders led out of their character, their knowledge of God and their love for others. ... It's safe to conclude that the early churches did not operate around the modern idea of a singular leader."

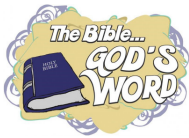
HG: You don't need to be a pastor or even be well-versed in the Bible to facilitate a group. Many of the group responsibilities can be shared with others in the group.

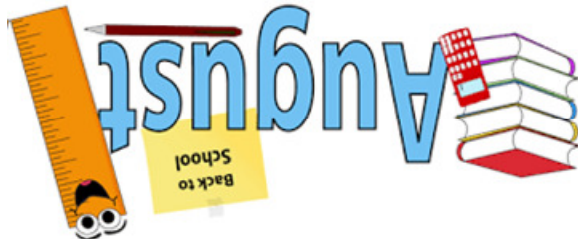

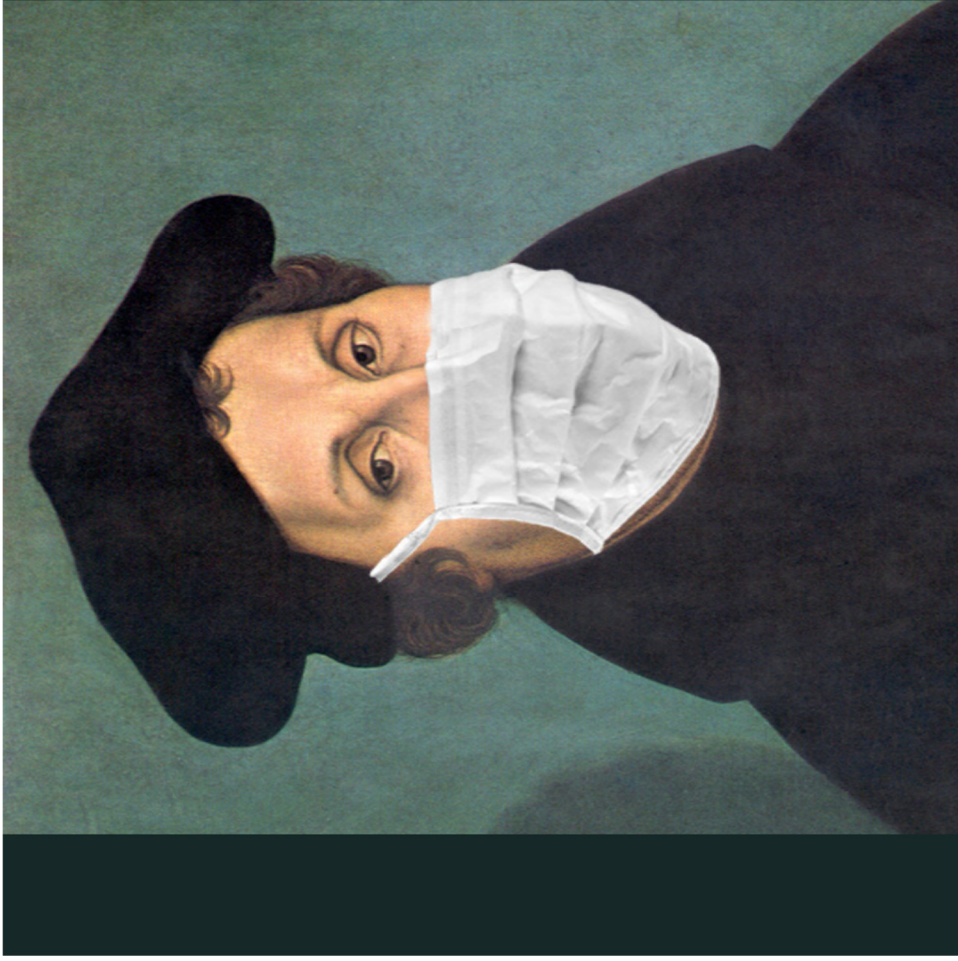
