

#### "Was It You?"

When I was a kid we often watched a weekly show on our black & white TV called, "The Lone Ranger." A few years later on Saturday mornings we got to watch a cartoon version of it on our color TV. A few years ago a movie version with the same title was released. They all featured a Native American by the name of Tonto and the main character who was the Lone Ranger. The later rode a white horse that rose up on its back hooves as the cowboy hero shouted, "Hi Ho Silver, Away!"

Inevitably the dynamic duo would take down a bandit or do a good deed, and those who experienced or observed the benevolent act would curiously ask as the mysterious pair rode off into the sunset, "who was that masked man?"



I hear there is a similar question being asked around town: "Who was that masked man?" "Who was that masked woman?" Sightings have been made as various individuals who have not been riding on the back of a stallion, but seated in cars and trucks offering acts of kindness and providing generous gestures. As these persons have dropped off food and supplies at homes and organizations, persons who have been touched by their compassionate care have also asked, "Who was that masked (wo)man?"

Fredericksburg's finest in blue have fielded many calls on who the possible persons maybe, but due to the masks, the identity of these big hearted souls is yet unknown and likely to remain unknown. The hope is that whoever these sneaky do-gooders are, that they will continue their ride well into however long this outlaw-virus brings harm to others.

If anyone knows of the who may be responsible for these Christ-like actions, please do not breathe a word for Jesus said, "*when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing*"(Matthew 6:3).

## HGLC'S BEST PRACTICE GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO WORSHIP

*We are excited to return to worship with everyone!*

*We also want to make sure we are still providing a place where everyone feels safe and welcome.*

*Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with these guidelines.*

1. **Worship with us Sunday mornings at 8:00am and 10:30am!** Saturday evening services will resume in the near future.
2. **125 is our current capacity.** This will allow us to worship in a socially-distant environment.
3. Our radio broadcast will continue to be available at 10:00am on KNAF 910AM, and our livestream will continue to be available at 10:30am on the HGLC Facebook page and YouTube channel.
4. **Everyone 65 years old and over, not feeling well, and/or otherwise at risk** is encouraged to stay home and engage in worship via the radio or social media.
5. **Masks/face coverings are required,** and are to be kept on at all times. Masks are available upon request.
6. **Temperatures will be able to be taken at the door.**
7. **Hand sanitizer will also be available at the door.** Everyone is encouraged to use it as you enter/exit the church.
8. **Social distancing is required** in the sanctuary, so please seat yourself accordingly. Families are of course welcome to sit together.
9. **Ushers will direct people to exit the church** from the rear to the front.
10. Please refrain from shaking hands and hugging.
11. **Restrooms should be occupied by one person at a time;** please knock before entering.
12. Hymns will be led by a song leader. Everyone is invited to sing softly, hum, or meditate on the words.
13. A secure offering box and special offering basket will be located at each entrance/exit.
14. Prayer requests may be sent to the church at 830-383-0249., or placed in the offering box.
15. **All surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected** between worship services.
16. Holy Communion, Sunday School, nursery childcare, Sunday volunteers, and coffee fellowship are all suspended for now.
17. Upon exiting, we encourage everyone to social-distance as you make a direct way to your vehicle.

## Groups May Begin to Gather on the HGLC Campus. Please Follow These Guidelines


