Let Go & Let God! Lent 2021

The season of Lent is fast approaching. Lent is a Christian tradition going back many centuries. It is a time of focus, meditation, reading, study, prayer, and worship to recall all that Jesus did for us. It is a reminder that Jesus came down from heaven to experience the full range of human life, both joy and sorrows. He healed many people, cast demons and evil spirits out of others, and taught us many truths about God. But the primary purpose that Jesus came was to die on the cross, taking the punishment for our sinfulness upon Himself. By doing so, Jesus redeemed us! Lent is a time to remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for us, so that we can then celebrate Easter, and Christ's victory over sin, death, and the devil with great joy and celebration. It gives us hope for a brighter and better future!

In this current season of life that we are in with added stress due to COVID, the divisions in our nation, and struggles in every day; life this season of Lent can be a great time for us to focus on the one constant that we have—Jesus Christ our Lord. Our theme for Lent will be “Let Go & Let God!” While that may be easier said than done, it is a worthy challenge that will only help us to grow stronger in our faith, and more sure of God's promises. It is about how we live out our discipleship in our daily lives.

The hymn, “Take My Life, That I May Be,” #406 in the LBW (Lutheran Book of Worship) or as it is affectionately known as, “The Green Hymnal,” will be our focus. The hymn was written by Frances Havergal in 1873. Frances was the daughter of a minister in England. She traveled to a “boarding house” and stayed there for five days. She wrote, *“There were ten persons in the house, some unconverted and long prayed for, some converted but not rejoicing Christians. [God] gave me the prayer, “Lord, give me all this house.” And He just did! Before I left the house, everyone had got a blessing. The last night of my visit. . . I was too happy to sleep and passed most of the night in praise and renewal of my own consecration, and these little couplets formed themselves and chimed in my heart, one after another, till they finished with “Ever, only, all, for Thee.”*”

Through her faith, Frances was able to touch the lives of ten people in their various struggles and stages of life and faith. The words of this hymn are powerful, as she reflects on twelve different aspects of our lives that we need to turn over to God, and trust in God to guide us and work in and through us to touch the lives of other people. We will be sharing these twelve themes connected to God's Word during our journey through Lent as we prepare to celebrate Easter. 9. A 175th anniversary team will be assembled to plan for the October 10, 2021 HGLC celebration of our founding (details pending COVID). Bishop Dan Selbo is scheduled to be the guest preacher that day! Mark your calendars.
10. The meeting ended at 8:30pm praying for the joys and concerns of many.

Sermon Series: The New Year sermon series continues with "Trees in the Bible" for the first half of the month and then Lent begins on February 17th with the series titled, "Let Go and Let God!"

Sun., Feb. 7: We continue our Trees of the Bible series with the Palm Tree, specifically thinking about those Oasis in the desert of our lives where we are fed, nourished, and rejuvenated for our service to God in our everyday life.

Sun., Feb. 14: The ultimate tree wood in the Bible is the cross! The final weekend of the "Trees in the Bible" sermon series will lead us to the cross and the one who hung there in our stead and for our salvation. Holy communion is served as we remember "The Old Rugged Cross."

Wed., Feb. 17: This year's Ash Wednesday service will be "ash-less" as extra measures of precaution are being exercised surrounding personal contact. Nonetheless, through a specially written liturgy, our frail human mortality will be a main theme as we recognize that we are "*dust and to dust we shall return.*" "*Take my life and let me be, consecrated Lord to Thee*" is our message focus. Holy communion reminds us that our earthly end is not our eternal ending.

Sun., Feb. 21: "Time"-- our most precious commodity is the part of our lives that we ask God to consecrate this week. It's something we never seem to have enough of and once gone, you can't get back! Regardless of your situation, it is possible to safely gather with others for encouragement, support, fellowship, and faith-building. Here are a few options:

- Join a Zoom group...there are several in progress at Holy Ghost:

 - Thursdays at 6:30pm...Pastor Alan leads a group that shares a light Bible study and visiting. To join, email Pastor Alan at: pastor.william1248@att.net
- Watch the weather forecast for a nice day and invite a few people to your yard/carport/barn for a visit. Many of us have little on our calendars these days, so you don’t need to give much notice! Ask your guests to bring their own lawn chairs and refreshments and to honor social distancing guidelines. Spend an hour catching up (or getting to know each other) and consider sharing a devotion, Bible verse, or prayer.
- Make some phone calls...an oldie but a goodie! Most cell phones allow you to connect more than two people at a time. Google the instructions for your particular phone (or ask a young person!). Maybe set a regular time to chat each week. Again, consider sharing a devotion, Bible verse, or prayer on your call.
- Watch the newsletter, bulletin, church website, and video announcements for groups and other activities that are meeting in person. Our church leadership is doing a tremendous job of promoting safe interactions in all activities that take place on church grounds.


