"I Went Through a Winter Storm and You Responded"

The Artic blast that settled over Texas will not soon be forgotten! With historic frigid temperatures for such an extended time, all of life was affected! All 254 Texas counties were under a winter storm warning at the same time! I heard that at one time, over nine-thousand homes in Gillespie county were without power. One rancher member of our church told a neighbor that he had twenty-seven degrees at his house one morning. The neighbor asked, "only twenty-seven; my thermometer showed three degrees." "Yes," responded the rancher, "twenty-seven degrees—in my bedroom!"

True story and in all seriousness, life-threatening situations were everywhere. Not only did humans take it on the chin, but livestock, wildlife, and vegetation felt the brunt as well. The landscape of area ranches and homes will never be the same! Unprecedented, unsettling and.... unwelcomed!

At the sending of this newsletter (February 28), there are peoples who are still displaced as a result of the icy snowstorm. Plumbers, linemen, electricians, tree cutters will not soon be out of work, though there are some persons who are yet without water, heat, electricity, and even a home.



Relief efforts from the get-go have been strong as many who have resources reached out to those who did not. Organizations, churches, individuals and volunteers offered food, housing, showers, money, rescue, wood, clean up, care calls and other much needed physical items. Some offered what they could in prayer which is no small thing! Plenty of heroes who would never count themselves as such have risen to the occasion of assistance.

Standing tall in the shortage of the life's basics has been the Needs Council. In the midst of scarcity, need, fear and worry— this community organization which serves Gillespie County residents has helped persons who never thought they would need to ask for aid for shelter, meals, warmth, water and emotional support.

As many of us get back to some sense of "normal" after having been out of power, water and heat, others still live in the wake of devastation as the fall out of the polar attack persists. The Needs Council is yet on the forefront providing relief and funds to offer services that are yet needed.

The months of February and March are annually slated as the Needs Council non-profit organizational fundraising period where donations are matched dollar for dollar. Holy Ghost Church supports this fantastic social ministry and invites each of us who are able to, do the same, particularly in this difficult season for our community.

In addition to the ice storm disaster, the Needs Council still attends to family crises, domestic violence, counseling, anger management, housing needs, medical bills, utilities, abuse intervention, child and senior services and more. They are THE "Go To" place that has the structure and experience in place to properly vet applicants to prevent abusing-the-system while providing compassionate needed care.

1. President Greg Henricksen called the meeting to order at 6:03pm
2. David Bullion, chairperson of the Building Team, presented the master site plan to the council which hopefully will be shared with the congregation in the late spring or early summer.
3. A church alarm system was discussed in light of the recent small fire in the basement due to a heating unit going out.
4. St. Peter, Doss will have its second vote to exit the ELCA on May 9. HGLC has been approached to consider offering some pastoral support for them.
5. An update from the Pastoral Call Team was given. Work is being done on creating a congregational profile.
6. The organ restoration project will begin sometime in the late spring or early summer.
7. A Small Group report created by Kim Gibbs, the small group coordinator, was celebrated as there are now about 150 persons in small groups.
8. The west side church entrance crash bar door is now in place and functional thanks to a special donation to cover the cost.
9. Live Streaming worship services was discussed, and a task force will be created to research and report to council.
10. Easter RSVP's will be taken (as was done for Christmas Eve) to assist in social distance seating.
11. A gazebo will be placed at the side entrance of the Kinderneest/Ed Building to replace the tarp awnings that continue to be destroyed by the wind. This is used for drop off and pick up of Kinderneest students.
12. The meeting ended at 9:15pm praying for the joys and concerns of many and concluding with the Lord's Prayer

Bi-Annual Congregational Meeting

The Bi-Annual Congregational meeting was postponed due to weather conditions and outages not allowing for the production of packets. Therefore the congregation will gather for ministry business on Sunday, March 7 at 11:30am to receive annual reports from ministry teams, groups and organizations! Other business includes voting on the interest distribution from the HGLC Trust Fund, receiving a recommendation to install a new H/AC system, a building program report, a finalized 2020 financial report and more. "Come, let us worship the Lord!"

MARCH WORSHIP THEMES

Sermon Series: "Let Go and Let God" as we further dig into the Green Book hymn #406 titled, "Take My Life That I May Be." Each Sunday and Wednesday a half verse of that song is coupled with a Bible passage that leads us into reflecting on the things we need to hand over to God. See the sermon line up below.

Wed., Mar. 3: *"Take my voice and let me sing, always, only for my King"* is the half verse that calls us to have praise of God constantly be on our tongues! He is Lord and King over all—"uber alles"-- so is deserving for all his servants to give Him homage. What song comes out of you? What do others hear you singing by your actions, behavior, language and attitude?

Sun., Mar. 7: The theme for today is about how we speak about Jesus to others. "Take my lips and let them be, filled with messages from Thee." Are we prepared to speak about Jesus? Or is that a subject we'd rather not discuss. We are passionate about sports and other topics, what about our passion for sharing the Good News of Jesus' love?

Wed., Mar. 10: This song would not be complete if it didn't mention our treasures, "Silver and Gold." In what ways are we challenged by God's Word not to hoard our treasures, but use them as they are intended, as a means to glorify and honor God.


Sun., Mar. 14: *"Take my intellect and use, every power as Thou shalt choose"* is the inspiration that leads us to consider such things as applying creativity and ingenuity to our faith. The story of the shrewd businessman from Luke 16:1-13 is the basis for the theme. Holy Communion will be served.

Wed., Mar. 17: *"Take my will and make it Thine, it shall be no longer mine"* is the challenging subject for the day. We constantly pray in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy will be done," but how often do we live out, "My will be done?" To pray the Lord's Prayer is actually a dangerous prayer because it invites us to surrender

Sun., Mar. 21: Our heart is the subject of today's message. Our heart and our head often clash with each other, one the center of our emotions, the other, the center of our wisdom and intellect (common sense). How might we learn to trust in God more?

Wed., Mar 24: The focus today is on worship. The psalms remind us, *"O come let us worship and bow down."* Is worship just for Sunday morning, or can we find ways to worship and celebrate God's presence in our daily lives?

Sun., Mar 28: *"Take myself and I will be, ever, only all for Thee"* is about dedicating our whole lives unto God. What parts do we give Him and what parts to we hold back on? God invites not half of our hearts, but our whole hearts. Matthew 22:37 is the Bible reference for being all-in with God. Holy Communion is on the menu.


