

#### The Hope of the Resurrection

We have just celebrated the pinnacle of our faith with the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ on Easter. The primary message of the church is to proclaim this Good News that Jesus was crucified on the cross, dying for the sins of the world, and then shattering death and the grave by rising again victoriously. The promise for those who believe is that when we die, we too shall be raised and share an eternal existence with God our Father in heaven.

Most people are uncomfortable talking about death, and that's reasonable considering that we want to hold on to this life as long as we can. And yet, death is inevitable. Every living thing dies, plants, animals, people. I consider myself to have a green thumb, and love to garden and grow all kinds of plants, but every person with a green thumb, has also experienced the loss of plants, no matter how much effort and love you put into it.

The same is true with us. We have wonderful medical advances that bring healing and hope beyond where we have ever been before. And yet, with all of our expertise and research, we cannot stop people from dying. These bodies we have don't last forever. The older a person gets, the more they experience the wear and tear. So, what hope do we have?


One of my favorite texts when speaking about death and resurrection is that powerful passage from John 14:1-6. Jesus begins that passage by reassuring us. "Don't let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God. Believe also in Me." Jesus is the resurrection and the life, and He is reminding us of His power over life and death.

He continues by telling us that He has gone to prepare a place for us. Some Bible versions tell us that this dwelling place is a home or a room, or even a mansion. Think of it this way, Jesus has gone ahead, and

made a reservation for us in Hotel Heaven, and it's not a one night stay or even a weekend stay. It is booked for eternity. He has made the reservation for us.

Then He reminds us that He will come again and take us to Himself, that where He is we may be also. When we die, Jesus will be there to escort us to our eternal dwelling place. He will reach out and take us by the hand and lead us, and everything will be okay.

Last week, we had a memorial service for my Aunt Vivian, my mom's younger sister. She fought a hard battle with cancer and is now at rest. After the service at the church, we were invited down the hallway to the commons (fellowship hall), where there was food. A feast where we would eat and visit and share memories and gather with family.



running and grabbed my hand. She didn't know where we were going, but she was going with her Opie, her hand in mine, and she bounded joyfully down the hallway. When we came to the table where the food was laid out, a smile of joy came over her face and she was ready for the feast.

That's the hope that I have when I think about the picture that Jesus portrays for us in this text. Jesus is so much more than an Opie or an Omie. He is our risen Lord and Savior. We are going to recognize His bright shining face, and when He reaches out His hand for us, we don't know exactly where we are going, but we know that we are going with Him, and we're going to have a really great time. So we willingly and joyfully walk hand in hand with our Savior as He leads us to that heavenly banquet, where we will spend time with all those who have gone ahead of us, in heavenly fellowship with one another, and with God our Father.

What a beautiful, hope-filled picture that Jesus gives us, and what peace we have knowing that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. May we continue to share this Good News with others, that they may know about Jesus and what He has to offer.

#### COUNCIL NOTES April 10, 2023

- 1. Pastor Steve led the opening devotion and prayer on how we make decisions: "personally based" or "biblically based."
- 2. Polly Zenner was appointed by the council to fill the twenty month vacancy left by Don Reinke who recently moved from Fredericksburg.
- 3. Norm Nevins was the guest who shared the security measures taken while worshipping in the Fellowship Hall.
- 4. The North American Lutheran Church assembly will be held in Oklahoma City in August. Pastor David invited council persons to consider attending as delegates.
- 5. The council toured the Fellowship Hall set up for worship.
- 6. With the transitioning of Pastor Clint out of the youth program, a recommendation was made to create a task force to develop a job description for one person who would lead the entire youth program, children and youth.
- Council visited the possibility of Pastor Clint remaining on pastoral staff half-time (instead of 2/3 time), working in some needed roles that council identified at the January council retreat.
- 8. Voted to decrease property insurance premiums by raising the deductible from \$25K to \$30K.
- 9. The spruce-up project for the former Priem parsonage was discussed as bid estimates are being received.
- 10. Confirmation Sunday is May 7 at 10:30am.
- 11. The youth chicken BBQ is Sunday, April 30.
- 12. Pastor Bobby closed the meeting with prayer at 8:30pm.
