What's on Your Mind?

Israel and Gaza? Hezbollah and Iran? Speaker of the House chaos? The health of loved ones (or your own diagnosis)? Money issues? Troubles at work? Relationship challenges? The list of things and events that can hijack our thoughts and sometimes our sleep may seem endless. Many people, even those who don't believe in Jesus Christ, have a sense that the world is not as it should be. Injustice, pain, suffering, war, and broken hearts are but signs that there is a deep and abiding problem with this world. The world is, to put it bluntly, broken. Who of us, when something precious to us breaks, doesn't grieve at least a little? So what are we to do?

One of the most comforting hymns of the Church was originally penned as a poem by Joseph Scriven in 1855. Scriven was a man well-acquainted with tragedy. His fiancé died in a drowning accident the day before their wedding. In his grief, he moved from Ireland to Canada to start over. There he fell in love again, and just weeks before the wedding, his fiancé died of a terrible illness. He was just 25 years old. In the midst of his grief, he devoted himself to serving the poor. A few years later, his mother in Ireland became seriously ill. With no money to travel back home, Scriven wrote a poem of encouragement and hope for her. We know that poem as "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." When your mind is filled with thoughts of the troubles of this life in the coming month, I encourage you to not only listen to or sing this song but also to lift it up as a prayer: "What a friend we have in Jesus, All our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry Everything to God in prayer! Oh, what peace we often forfeit; Oh, what needless pain we bear – All because we do not carry Everything to God in prayer!" And what will the Lord do for you? "In his arms, he'll take and shield you; You will find a solace there."

As you pray throughout this coming month, dive deeply into God's Word. Consider these verses as you pray, and consider God's promises to you: Ephesians 6:18; Philippians 4:6-7; Colossians 4:2-4; James 5:13, and, for a wonderful summary of how God is at work through Jesus Christ: Colossians 1:9-23.

Finally, another word of encouragement. In Revelation 21 we hear these words: "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." In other words, no matter how much trouble comes on this earth or in our lives, in the end, Jesus wins (and we win with Him)! He will indeed "take and shield you" dear beloved children of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. May you experience His peace that passes all understanding in these coming days!

A Word about a Special TAX SAVINGS Opportunity to Give:
Required Minimum Distribution

The dreaded RMD is the requirement from the IRS that once you reach the age of 70 1/2, you must take distributions from your IRA, SEP, Simple, or retirement account. In most cases, this results in taxable income to add to the tax return in the year of the distribution. But wait! There is an exception! The IRS allows you to make a tax-free transfer to a charity of your choice from your retirement account. You don't need to itemize deductions to get the tax benefit. Making a tax-free transfer also keeps the money out of your gross income. That could help you avoid the Medicare high-income surcharge in certain tax brackets. Keeping money out of your adjusted gross income could also make less of your Social Security benefits taxable. Do you have an RMD this year? *Talk to your accountant and your broker* to see if you can designate some of the required amount paid to the charity of your choice. For example:

Required Minimum Distribution	\$5,000
Check from broker payable to the charity of your choice	\$1,000
Taxable distribution for 2023 to your return	\$4,000

HELP!! The Medical Equipment Team inventory is out of wheelchairs and has only a few rollators. If you know of any not in use, please contact Paul Unger (512-760-5788) or Sandy Birdlebough (830-998-4504) or drop them off at the church office.

The Medical Equipment Team continues to maintain a supply of slightly used medical devices to loan to HGLC members and their immediate families at no cost. In the past equipment was provided primarily for back surgeries, and knee and hip replacements. Since Covid, the need for short term transitions from nursing facilities to homes has greatly expanded to where our supply of rollators and wheel chairs is quite limited. We still have a good supply of slider and wheeled walkers, crutches, and canes.

We would like to expand this ministry to include Doss and Cave Creek. With your help we can resupply our inventory to get us where we need to be. If you have an unneeded wheelchair, rollator, or other medical assistance device, please consider donating it. Also, if you have borrowed any equipment and no longer need it, please return it for others to use. Items can be dropped off at the church office or by contacting any of the team members.

NOVEMBER WORSHIP THEMES

Messages in November:

Sat. & Sun., Nov. 4 & Nov. 5: It is All Saints Weekend as we set aside time in our worship service to honor and remember those from our family of faith who died this last year. Our faith word for this week is HOPE. Our ultimate hope is in the Lord who created us, redeemed us, and gave us the victory over sin and death with the promise of eternal life.

Sat. & Sun., Nov. 11 & Nov. 12: "Encouragement" is the faith word of the week as the focus is on the strength we receive from others as well as the hope that God calls us to pour into others. The Women of the Church lead parts of the worship service while one of the pastors brings the Word! Holy Communion is served.

Sat. & Sun., Nov. 18 & Nov. 19: "LOVE" - The Apostle John tells us that "God is love" (1 John 4:16) and He is the source of love. (1 John 4:7). God's love for us and our call to love the Lord God above any other is a central tenet of our faith. But what does God say about the true nature of love and how we are designed to live as human beings? We invite you to carefully meditate on both 1 Corinthians 12:31- 14:1 and 1 John 4:7-21 as you prepare for the weekend.

Wed., Nov. 22: Thanksgiving Eve: "Thanksgiving" is the appropriate faith word as we enter into Thanksgiving weekend. Fifth graders receive their first communion as we all give thanks to God for God's gift of Jesus to us! Services are at 11am & 6:30pm.

Sat. & Sun., Nov. 25 & Nov. 26: "SHALOM" Jesus is the Prince of Peace (Shalom) announced by the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 9:6). The Apostle John records Jesus' words to His disciples shortly before He would be arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you...do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27) There are many practical and important implications of the gift of peace. It is a gift for you that is shared with us and sustained in us through the Holy Spirit. We invite you to consider carefully John 14:25-27 and Galatians 5:22-23. Holy Communion will be served.

The Fall Sermon Series is titled "Faith Words" as common but complex words used in the church are further explored and explained.

October 23, 2023

1. Pastor Steve opened with a devotion about training in prayer.
2. David Bullion, the chairperson of the Building Team, offered an update on the building project. Phase one is approximately one-third complete with about \$1.2M being spent.
3. A sound task force is being formed to provide direction for sound and technology as the move is made back to the sanctuary.
4. Hiram Lucius, congregational treasurer, presented an ACH program that the church will participate in with 1st United Bank.
5. The 2024 budget will be finalized at the November council meeting.
6. The Christmas day dinner will be served for members and community inviting St. Paul, Cave Creek & St. Peter, Doss.
7. The Christmas day worship service will be held in the Youth Center due to the Christmas day dinner being in the Fellowship Hall.
8. Christmas Eve services this year will be at 3pm, 5pm & 7pm. Since Christmas Eve is on a Sunday regular weekend services will also be held on Saturday, 6pm, and Sunday, 8am & 10:30am.
9. The meeting ended at 8pm & Pastor David concluded the meeting with prayer.

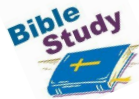



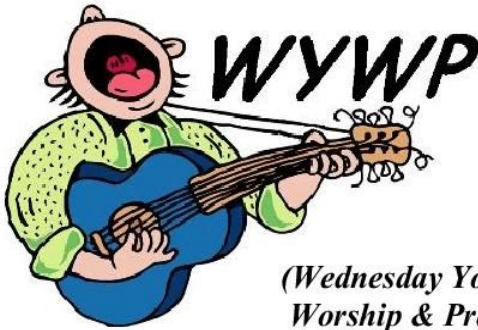
