Confession and Forgiveness of Sins

L: We begin in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

L: Beloved of God, St. Paul reminds us in Romans 3:23 that we all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We are to approach God's throne of grace with confidence, confessing our sins to Him. We confess to Him in the silence of our hearts.

L: Now we confess our sins as a community of faith. Most merciful God,

⁹ There he came to a cave and lodged in it. And behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and he said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁰ He said, "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. L: Because of Christ, God's people can proclaim: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race."

C: "Now is saved up for me the crown of righteousness!"

L: In the face of death we boldly shout: "O death where is your victory?"

C: "O death, where is your sting!"

L: Jesus promises in Revelation: "Be faithful unto death."

C: "and I will give you the crown of life."

L: Let us pray. Blessed are You, O Lord our God, King of the universe. Your days are without number; a thousand years in Your sight are like yesterday when it is past. You are the Lord of the past, present, and future: You hold eternity in the palm of Your hand. You are the Alpha and the Omega.
