Created to Serve

We have been created to glorify and serve the risen Lord Jesus. In Revelation 4:11 the heavens ring out: "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being."

How can we, mere human beings, glorify and honor the Lord God Almighty this side of heaven? We begin by coming to grips with the fact that there is nothing "mere" about us. We have been created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27) and are His beloved children (1 John 3:1). The depth of God's call on our lives echoes throughout the Old and New Testament. Joshua calls on the people: "choose this day whom you will serve... as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24). But how can we serve the One who needs nothing from us? We can't wash His feet or bring Him a meal or help Him clear cedar from His land. Fortunately, we don't have to guess what our Lord is talking about. St. Paul writes: "You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather serve one another humbly in love." (Galatians 5:13) And again, in Paul's letter to the Ephesians: "Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not people." (Ephesians 6:7)

In other words, we serve Him by serving the people around us. In one of the most direct statements of the importance of caring for people around us, Jesus shares the reminder of the final judgment when He returns to separate the sheep from the goats. He tells the people, "I was hungry and you fed me." "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink." And Jesus explained: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40) These encouraging words are also accompanied with a warning: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me." (v.45) Those who received this message were in deep trouble!

The great news, dear brothers and sisters in Christ, is that you have been created to serve. Paul sums it up beautifully in Ephesians 2:10: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works." Saved by grace through faith? Yes! Saved for a purpose? Absolutely!

Now go out every hour of every day in peace and serve the Lord! Thanks be to God!

- Welcomed two guests, Jennifer Easterwood, who introduced herself to the council as our new Bookkeeper and Glen Treibs, who shared his thoughts about council nominations.
- 3. A motion was passed for Pastor Qualben to designate a portion of his salary as housing allowance for tax savings purposes.
- The 2026 budget was presented and passed with a plan to have time set aside before the biannual meeting, for interested persons to ask questions.
- 5. A walkthrough of Parsonage 2 will take place soon to identify any repairs that need taken care of before Pastor Tobias Heike arrives in February.
- Gave thanks for receiving a \$3,000 gift from Create Healthy to help with our community Christmas Dinner on Christmas Day.

- 7. A request was made to consider congregational potluck

- Voted to move council meetings during the Holidays to November 17, and December 15.





<u>Current Sermon Series - "Epic Fails – God Prevails"</u>
God's will prevails in the midst of the muddled mess we make of things in our lives and in this world. The Bible continually points to God's work in this world. The children at Kindernest often sing together: "My God is so great, so strong and so mighty, there's nothing my God cannot do." That one little verse expresses a basic truth that we see throughout the Bible: no matter how many times those who have gone before us have failed – God is still at work!



Messages in November



Sat. & Sun., Nov 1 & 2: This is All Saints Weekend where we pause to remember all those in the congregation who have died in the previous year. The focus is on Elijah on the run, thinking he was the only prophet left, and fearing for his own life. Yet, God spoke powerful words of reassurance for him.

<u>Sat. & Sun., Nov 8 & 9</u>: <u>(Communion) - WOMEN'S THANKOFFERING</u> "Epic Fails - God Prevails: Peter the Disciple" Peter was chosen by Jesus, made one of the greatest confessions of faith: "You are the Messiah." (Mark 8); was one of the three disciples (Peter, James and John) that were taken up the mount of transfiguration (Mark 9), walks on water with Jesus (Matthew 14); but denies he even knows Jesus on the night of our Lord's trial. We see the failures, but how will God prevail? In preparation for the weekend message, please read Mark 14:27-31 and John 21:15-21.

<u>Sat. & Sun., Nov 15 & 16</u>: Our Epic Fail for today is Saul who began as an enemy of the early Christian church until he had a literal "Come to Jesus" meeting on the road to Damascus. Jesus changed his name to Paul, and he became one of the greatest evangelists the church has ever known.

<u>Sat. & Sun., Nov 22 & 23</u>: <u>(Communion) - Final week of "Epic Fails/God Prevails" series</u> "Epic Fails - God Prevails: The Cross" St. Paul tells us "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (1 Corinthians 1:18) We conclude our series "Epic Fails/God Prevails" with the pivotal events in all of human history: the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus the Messiah. The crucifixion would appear to be the most epic failure of all history. Instead, through the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, God changes everything!

November 26th: (Thanksgiving Eve) (Communion) - 1ST COMMUNION Our traditional Thanksgiving Eve services will take place on Wednesday, November 26th at 11:00am and 6:30pm in the Sanctuary. Our theme for the day is: "Saved by Grace/Created to Serve" based on John, Chapter 13.

<u>Sat. & Sun., Nov 29 & 30</u>: The season of Advent begins this weekend, as we prepare to celebrate Christ's coming. As we look ahead to Christmas, we must look beyond to the 2nd coming of Christ. We don't know the day or the hour, but how are we preparing?


We had such a great time at Hondo's in October. Their fish & chips are pretty good! And we made an astonishing number and variety of cards. Thanks for the great turn-out!

A Word for Those who are 70 ½ Years Old or Older!!

The Required Minimum Distribution is the requirement by the IRS that once you reach the age of 70 ½, you must take distributions from your IRA, SEP, Simple, or retirement account. In most cases, this results in taxable income to add to the tax return in the year of the distribution. But wait! There is an exception! The IRS allows you to make a tax-free transfer to a charity of your choice from your retirement account. You don't need to itemize deductions to get the tax benefit. Making a tax-free transfer also keeps the money out of your gross income. That could help you avoid the Medicare high-income surcharge in certain tax brackets. Keeping money out of your adjusted gross income could also make less of your Social Security benefits taxable. Do you have an RMD this year? Talk to your accountant and your broker to see if you can designate some of the required amount paid to the charity of your choice.
